Recognizing that the faith community must become a partner in community efforts to address the problem of violence in our community, the Portland United Methodist Association for Metropolitan Ministries (PUMA) is hosting a workshop entitled, "Toward a Community of Non-Violence" on Thursday evening, September 14, 7 p.m. - 9 p.m., at Laurelwood United Methodist Church, 6148 S.E. Holgate in Portland. It is open to the public and there is no charge.

Featured speakers are The Rev. Fred Smith, Assistant Director for Violence and Substance Abuse, Interfaith Health Program, The Carter Center, Atlanta, Georgia, and

Annette Stixrud, R.N., Program Director of Northwest Parish Nurse Ministries and Chair of a local task force on violence and the faith community.

Rev. Smith is also President of the executive committee of the National Interfaith Alliance Against Substance Abuse (NIAASA). He states, "The mission of NIAASA is to enlist the faith community in fulfilling its unique role as a catalyst bringing positive change and awareness in response to issues arising from the use, misuse, and abuse of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs." He is currently developing a national data base of exceptional interfaith and congregational models of health

ministries.

Ms. Stixrud is actively engaged locally in educating the faith community on its role in addressing violence and health issues.

She works with churches and organizations throughout the Northwest on developing prevention strategies within congregations to promote non-violence and provide positive re-enforcement to children in the community. An advocate for children, she emphasizes the need to build on children's strengths and virtues to enable them to cope with the stresses in today's society.



New Publishing Scholarship Award

Black Women in Publishing (BWIP) announced that the organization will present its first scholarship award at a gala luncheon ceremony on Saturday, September 23 from 12:00pm to 3:00pm at Birdland located at 2745 Broadway at 103rd Street, New York.

The highlight of the afternoon's festivities will be the award presentation to the finalist of the BWIP publishing scholarship competition, held earlier this year.

Special invited guests will include Susan Taylor, editor-in-chief of Essence Magazine and author of "In the Spirit", a compilation of her motivational thoughts on living a fulfilling life; and award winning journalist, Herb Boyd, who co-edited "Brotherman: the Odyssey of Black Men in America", an anthology of writings by African American men.

The awards, a milestone in the organization's sixteen-year history of service to women and men of color in the print media field will be presented annually to a matriculating student, with intentions of pursuing an editorial career in print media.

The scholarship fund was established by BWIP in 1993 in memory of Anna Marie Muskelly-Bryan. As

a founding members and dedicated supporter of the organization, Muskelly-Bryan had a reputation for sharing her skills and vast knowledge with young newcomers to the industry. It was the special request of her surviving husband, Fred Bryan that BWIP establish the fund on behalf of his deceased wife. Said Bryan on the organization's efforts, "Anna Maire worked diligently to educate all women and men about the world of publishing and to motivate people of color to pursue career in the industry. This is the mission of the organization. It is only fitting that her legacy live on through the scholarship."
