U.S. Sen. Mark O. Hatfield sponsored Oregon's Public Accommodations Law as a young state representative in 1953. The law made discrimination in public places based on race, religion or national origin illegal.

The dinner's other co-chair is Senior Circuit Court Judge Mercedes F. Deiz who is Oregon's first African American female attorney and judge. She became active in the Urban League of Portland soon after she arrived here in the 1940s.

Urban League President and CEO Lawrence J. Dark says the dinner will be dedicated to the people who have contributed to the league as staff, volunteers and clients since 1945.

"This dinner is a tribute to those unsung heroes and heroes who moved our community a little closer to equality," Dark said. "I look on this as a family reunion that the whole community is a part of."

The dinner will feature an audio/visual history of the league with live narration by Ken Boddie of KOIN-TV and Leah Hope of KATU-TV. A reception starts at 6:15 p.m. with dinner at 7:15 p.m. Tickets are \$50 per person, \$500 for a table of 10. Tickets can be ordered by calling (503) 280-2611.

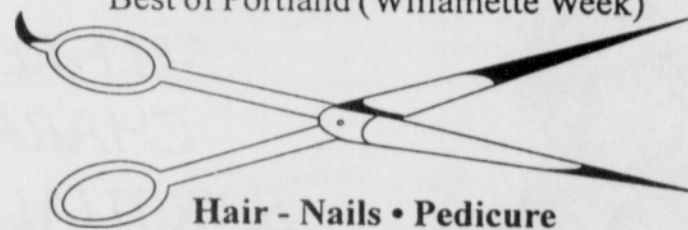

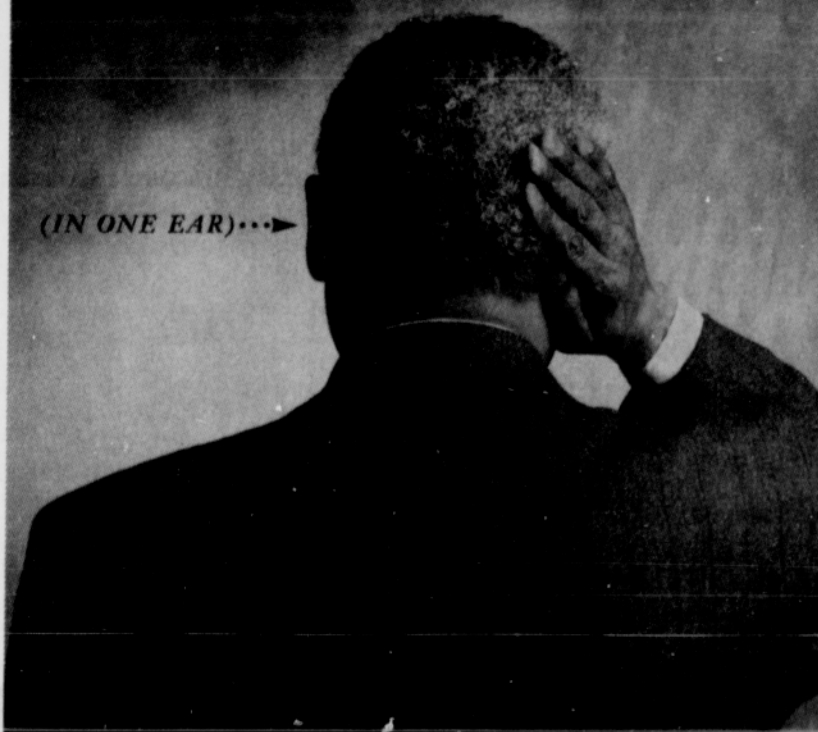
