Alpha Family Treatment Center Expansion

CODA Treatment Recovery Prevention will hold a groundbreaking ceremony, at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, October 3, 1995, at its residential drug treatment facility Alpha Family Treatment Center (AFTC), located at 1427 S. E. 182nd, in Gresham. The expansion will increase bed capacity from 26 to 48 beds, with the new bed space designated for women with children and pregnant, addicted women and their babies.

CODA, founded in 1969, is Portland and S.W. Washington's largest and most comprehensive non-profit drug and alcohol abuse treatment and prevention agency. CODA has provided residential treatment services for 19 years, five years at its current Gresham location.

Residential treatment is particularly effective for individuals and families with long histories of drug abuse and crime.

Due to community resources like AFTC, the number of drug-addicted babies born in Multnomah County has been reduced by 62% in the past five years.




