

# Zoo Night Horrors Return

## Haunting Fun Begins Oct. 13

Frankenstein, Dracula and a number of their ghoulish fiends will make the Metro Washington Park Zoo their nightly place of terror beginning Oct. 13. They'll be haunting the fifth annual ZooBoo, a screamfest of monstrous creatures, ghosts and headless goblins.

ZooBoo, sponsored by KINK fm 1302 and Coca Cola with support from Sierra Antifreeze-Coolant, is entitled "It Was a Dark and Stormy Night."

The frightening family fun features hair-raising scenes inspired by literature's most famous horror classics.

Visitors will be "treated" to a dark and mysterious mile-long ride on the zoo's train as it chugs along a spine-tingling route filled with 26 theatrical sets. Spooky scenes stolen from Edgar Allan Poe, Shakespeare and Jules Verne will keep riders in worrisome suspense throughout.

Dracula and his fellow vampires will be seen roaming among bats and coffins. Frankenstein and his hunchback buddy, Igor, will be dying to great visitors.

A huge dragon is guaranteed to attack the train at any time. Skeleton pirates will battle along the route while nearby a sea monster arises from the

ocean depths. And werewolves, the mad barber Sweeny Todd and Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde will showcase their torsorial skills at the "Bad Hair Night" junction.

The train trip will end with intrepid travelers trekking on foot

through the spooky mazes the Haunted Forest. Along the way they will view a frightening carnival freak show featuring bizarre almost-human "things" who are billed as "Something Wicked This Way Comes." The forest also features Thor's Thunder alley of light-

ning bolts, a monster fighting hobbits at the Lord of the Rings set, and a wax museum with Lizzie Borden, Jack the Ripper, Rasputin and other evil characters from the past.

But the train ride is only half the fun for ZooBoo participants.

## Alpha Family Treatment Center Expansion

CODA Treatment Recovery Prevention will hold a groundbreaking ceremony, at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, October 3, 1995, at its residential drug treatment facility Alpha Family Treatment Center (AFTC), located at 1427 S. E. 182nd, in Gresham. The expansion will increase bed capacity from 26 to 48 beds, with the new bed space designated for women with children and pregnant, addicted women and their babies.

CODA, founded in 1969, is Portland and S.W. Washington's largest and most comprehensive non-profit drug and alcohol abuse treatment and prevention agency. CODA has provided residential treatment services for 19 years, five years at its current Gresham location.

Residential treatment is particularly effective for individuals and families with long histories of drug abuse and crime.

Due to community resources like AFTC, the number of drug-addicted babies born in Multnomah County has been reduced by 62% in the past five years.

## Antidotes To Violence

The Sixth annual conference of Northwest Parish Nurse Ministries, Breaking the Cycle of Violence Part II: Signs of Hope and Renewal will be held on Friday, October 13, 1995, at Fremont United Methodist Church, 2620 N. Fremont, Portland, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Registration begins at 7:30 a.m. for this one-day roundtable conference, which will focus on family violence, gun violence, and antidotes to violence. Keynote speakers will be Frank Noonan, As-

stant to the U.S. Attorney for the State of Oregon, and Bruce Goldberg, M.S., Assistant Professor, Department of Family Medicine, Oregon Health Sciences University.

Other presentations and panel discussions will focus on conflict resolution, the Virtues Project, safe havens for children, and assets kids need to succeed. Conference attendees will participate in developing a prayer and covenant to safeguard our children.

Representatives from local faith communities working in partnership with families, schools, and the communities that surround them will share examples and resources on how they are already making a difference.
