Blood Recipient Encourages African Americans To Roll Up Their Sleeves

Increasing the number of African American blood donors is a cause near to Everette Rice's heart. Rice, Director of American Red Cross Blood Services' Marrow Donor Services Department, has been on both the giving and receiving end of lifesaving blood donations.

In July 1994, Rice needed major surgery to repair organ damage caused by gall bladder disease and stomach complications. During and after the procedure, he received nine units of

"Until then, I'd always known the importance of giving blood. but it had never personally impacted me," Rice said. "Blood donors are very special people. They helped me, someone they didn't even know, at a time when I really needed it."

For five years prior to his surgery, Rice donated blood once or twice a year. He first became

aware of the need for blood when he was ten years old and his mother needed blood as a result of a kidney disorder. Blood and blood components also played a key role in the recoveries of several relatives injured in car accidents.

Since Rice received his transfusions, he has been actively involved in increasing awareness of the critical need for blood.

"I'd like for people to realize the importance of giving blood without having to experience the need for blood first-had," said Rice. "I don't want others to have to go through what I did, I want them to know how important an adequate blood supply is."

Rice feels fortunate to be able to forward his personal cause through his work. As Director for American Red Cross Blood Services' Marrow Donor Services Donor Department, actively recruiting people of color to give blood and join the National Marrow Donor Registry is one of his primary responsibilities.

Rice's involvement with marrow donor recruitment began several years before his work with Red Cross, when he volunteered for several blood and marrow donor drives dedicated to a friend with leukemia who needed a marrow transplants.

"My friend is always in my heart when I recruit," Rice said. "He's the driving force behind my efforts.'

Rice's work is also an opportunity to pay back the volunteer blood donors who gave him another chance at life through their blood donations.

"I think that if you're a responsible person, you always remember where you come from," Rice said, "I want to make sure others are there for people who need blood and marrow. I guess I'm living testimony for why it's important to give blood for people you may never meet."
