GERVIN, THOMPSON, GOODRICH NAMED TO HALL

Former college and pro stars George Gervin, David Thompson and Gail Goodrich were among six former players elected Monday to the Basketball Hall of

Also elected were former European star Kresimir Cosic, who died last May at the age of 46, women's star Nancy Lieberman-Cline and early National Basketball Association star George Yardley.

Enshrinement ceremonies at the Basketball Hall of Fame will be May 6.

Gervin, who played in the American Basketball Association and the NBA, was a 12-time All-Star and one of only three players in NBA history to win four or more scoring titles. His career scoring average of 26.2 points a game is the sixth highest in NBA

Gervin is one of only seven players in NBA history to score more than 2,000 points in six consecutive seasons and he is one of only four players in league history to score in double figures in 400 or more games. Gervin had a 63-point single-game

performance in 1978 and is one of only 15 players in NBA history to surpass 60 points in a regular-season

Thompson was a three-time All-America at North Carolina State and was named College Basketball Player of the Year twice. Thompson was named the Most Valuable Player of the 1974 NCAA Championship tournament and his No. 44 jersey is the only one ever retired at North Caro-

Thompson was the ABA Rookie of the Year and Most Valuable Player

in the All-Star game, played in four NBA All-Star games and was named the game's MVP in 1979, becoming the only player to win the award in both leagues.

Thompson averaged 22.1 points a game and his 73-point performance against Detroit in April 1978 is the third highest in NBA history. His No. 33 jersey also has been retired by the Denver Nuggets.

Goodrich helped lead UCLA to two NCAA championships and led his conference in scoring as the Bruins went 30-0 in 1964. He went on to

play 14 seasons in the NBA, where he was selected to the All-Star team five times.

Yardley played seven seasons in the NBA and in 1957-58 became the first player to score 2,000 points in a season. He was named to the NBA All-Star team six times and averaged 19.2 points for his career.

Cosic, who died last May from lymphoma, starred at Brigham Young but made his reputation on the international scene. After leading BYU in scoring in his final two years, he went on to play on four Olympic teams for the former Yugoslavia.

He was a member of the silver medal team in 1968 and the gold medal team in 1980 and starred for two World Championship Gold" Medal teams.

Lieberman played on two Pan American gold medal winning teams and played for the U.S. team that won the silver medal at the 1976 Olympics. Lieberman was a three-time All-America at Old Dominion and led the school to back-to-back national championships in 1979 and

The Blazers, to their credit, have remained competitive and have been in most games, including the two with the 41-4 Chicago Bulls. The free-throw shooting has cost them dearly as they are on pace (62 percent) to break the NBA record for worst percentage in a season.

Look for the Blazers to battle the Nuggets for the eighth spot in the west right down to the last game to keep it's 13-year playoff streak alive.

Nuggets Snap Bulls Streak

All the stars were out to see Magic Johnson and the Lakers break the 17-game winning streak of the Chicago Bulls as "Showtime" was alive again in L.A. But Magic scored 15 points and the Lakers lost 84-99 Friday night. Sunday the Bulls walked into McNichols Arena with a 41-3 record and walked away with the forth longest winning streak halted in the hands of the 19-26 Den-

ver Nuggets. The Nuggets withstood a 31point come-back from the Bulls to win 105-99 with Michael Jordan scoring 22 in the third quarter and 39 for the game. The loss was Chicago's first since a 103-97 defeat Dec. 26, and broke their nine game road victory streak.


