

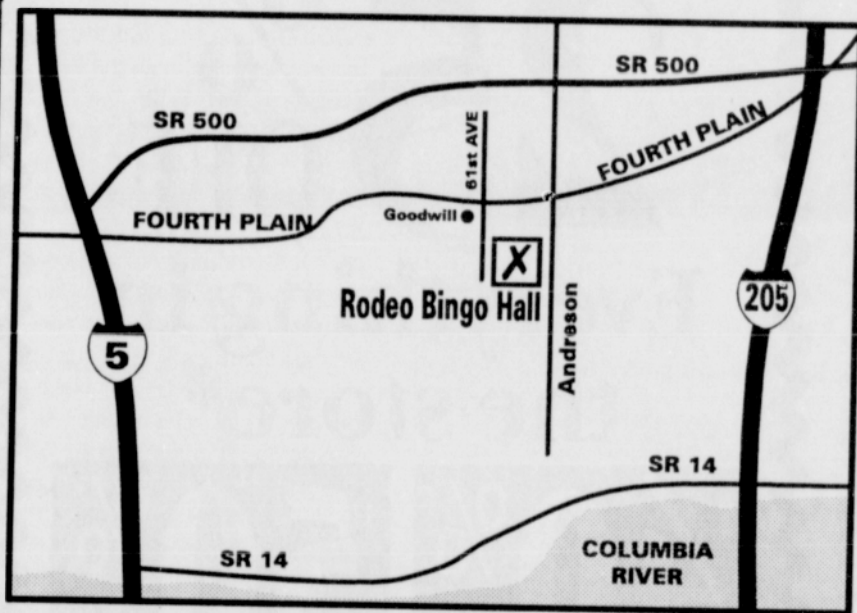

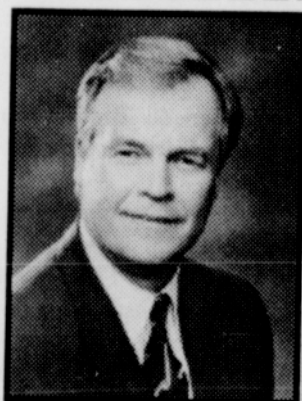

Robbery Subject Wanted

Portland Police Bureau Special Property Investigations detectives, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, are asking for your help in locating and apprehending Derrek Linn Kreitzer.

Felony arrest warrants, charging Kreitzer with Unauthorized use of a Vehicle, Third Degree Robbery, Second Degree Theft, and Failure to Appear in court, are on file. In addition, investigators want to question Kreitzer in connection with a large quantity of suspected stolen property that has been sold

to secondhand stores throughout the metropolitan area.

Derrek Linn Kreitzer, who may also use the name Derrek Linn Smith, is a 21-year-old white male (DOB/09-03-74) 6'4", 210 pounds, with blond hair and blue eyes.

Crime Stoppers is offering a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information, reported to Crime Stoppers, that leads to an arrest in this case or any unsolved felony crime, and you can remain anonymous. Call Crime Stoppers at (503) 823-HELP.

Mail Theft Hits Collection Boxes

The U.S. Postal Inspection Service, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, is asking for your help in identifying and apprehending the person or persons responsible for the theft of mail. The mail is commonly stolen from house letter boxes and blue postal collection boxes.

Most mail thieves are looking for checks that can be altered and cashed to support drug habits. They may also be looking for cash, cred-

it cards, and boxes of new checks.

Those caught stealing mail and attempting to cash checks may be prosecuted in federal court for theft and bank fraud. In addition, offenders could also be prosecuted in state court for forgery and credit card fraud.

Many mail thefts can be prevented. The postal Service says never send cash through the mail, retrieve your mail from the mailbox as soon as possible after delivery, and never leave outgoing mail in the box with

the red flag up. Notify the post office of address changes, and if you plan on being out of town, ask the post office to hold your mail.

If you have information which leads to the identification and arrest of anyone responsible for stealing mail, rewards are available through the U.S. Postal Inspection Service or Crime Stoppers. As always, you can remain anonymous. Call Crime Stoppers at (503) 823-HELP.

Attempted Child Abduction Thwarted

A Vancouver, Washington man was arrested Monday afternoon after he grabbed a 2-year-old girl and pulled her away from her mother. The mother was able to pull the child back from the man. He was stopped by nearby security guards and held for Central Precinct officers.

The incident occurred about 2:00 p.m. Witnesses saw the suspect, Stanley Allen Bankhead, DOB 09-23-68, walking quickly along the

sidewalk.

Reportedly, Bankhead shoved a pedestrian against a wall then walked up to the woman and her child, who were standing on the sidewalk. Allegedly, Bankhead picked the 2-year-old child up in a "bear hug" and began to walk away. The mother was able to pull her daughter back. Bankhead then reportedly walked away and was stopped and detained by a nearby security guard who heard the commotion. Bankhead was then

arrested by Central Precinct officers and transported to the Justice Center Jail.

Bankhead has been charged with Attempted Kidnapping In The First Degree, And Attempted Sex Abuse In The First Degree. He is being held on \$200,000 bail, enhanced by Multnomah County Judge Anna Brown. Bankhead faces an initial court appearance on Tuesday. A photo will be available at the Identification Division.
