A \$21,500 grant was awarded to the Ochoco Chapter of Trout Unlimited to work with the Bureau of Land Management, the Forest Service, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, local school districts, and private landowners to restore riparian and wet meadow complexes in the Crooked River Basin in Oregon. Total project cost is about \$126,000.
