The Tenth Anniversary Essence Awards

The Tenth Anniversary Essence Awards Celebration will take place Friday, April 4, 1997, at 7:30 P.M. at The Theater at Madison Square Garden.
 Confirmed honorees for the 1997 Essence Awards include boxing great Muhammad Ali and 1996 Olympic Gold Medal Gymnast Dominique Dawes. Ali will receive a special Living Legend award in recognition of his lifetime of achievement.
 The 1997 Essence Awards will also feature the presentation of the first Essence Triumphant Spirit Awards, established to honor an outstanding African-American who exemplifies the true spirit of Essence through her or his extraordinary actions, accomplishments and attitude.
 For the fourth year in a row, Fox Broadcasting will air the Essence Awards as a two-hour prime-time special. No date for the airing has yet been scheduled.



The statistics about young black men are familiar: Homicide is their #1 killer; one fourth are in jail, on parole, or probation; and their rates of unemployment, teen fatherhood, educational dropout-and death-exceed those of any other demographic group. *Living to Tell About It* is the first book to look beyond the statistics at the real lives of most young black men in America today. Journalist Darrell Dawsey traveled across country, listening to young men talk about their childhoods, relationships with parents and women, sexuality, self-respect, spirituality, and ambitions. The result is a portrait of a generation facing manifold challenges and dilemmas of black manhood-and living to tell about it.

33 FAINTING SPELLS

The Portland Institute for Contemporary Art (PICA) presents Seattle-based dance theater company 33 Fainting Spells, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, March 20-22 at 8 p.m. at the Scottish Rite Center.
 Created by Dayna Hanson and Gaelen Hanson (no relation) in 1993, 33 Fainting Spells' innovative approach to performance has earned them international recognition in a very short span of time.
 33 Fainting Spells first short work, *Tsigane*, catapulted the duo into the international spotlight when it received top honors at the prestigious X-Change Festival in Dusseldorf, Germany in 1995. The piece was then expanded into their first evening-length dance theater duet, *The Uninvited*. Choreographed to an eclectic score of works by 20th century composers, *The Uninvited* had its world premiere in a sold-out, extended run at Seattle's On the Boards, as part of the programs' New Performance Series.
 Elegantly built around a variety of household props, *The Uninvited* is a sophisticated tale exploring the psychological interplay that comes from an unexpected encounter with an unwelcomed visitor. Haunting, humorous, stirring and physical movement that reveals the strange, often absurd oscillation between fear and longing in human relationships.
 Packed with uncanny non-sequiturs and a refreshing visual design, *The Uninvited* is a carefully crafted physically articulate and dynamic dance theater event.

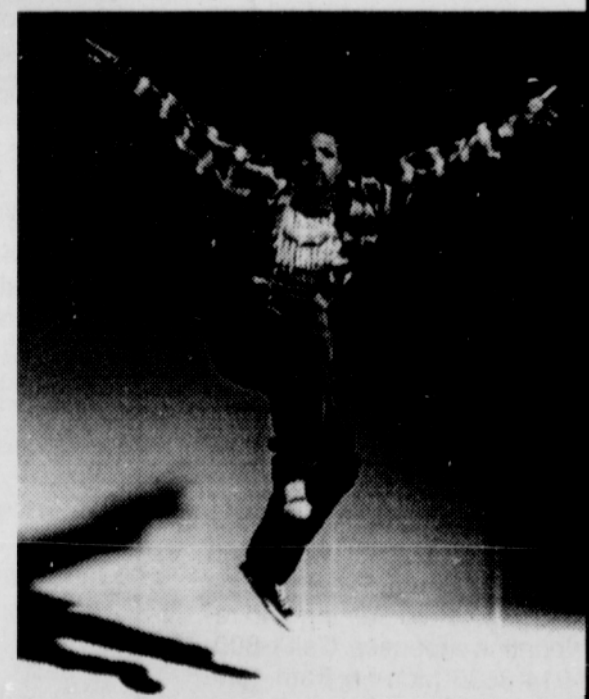
