## Chemistry Instructor

Clark College, a public community college in Vancouver, Washington, is accepting applications for a one-year, full-time temporary teaching position in Chemistry starting September, 1997.

**Primary responsibilities will include the instruction of general and preparatory chemistry courses and laboratories.**

The minimum requirement is a **Masters' Degree in Chemistry**. Preference will be given to those with college teaching experience at the lower division class level and a demonstrated ability to work well with adults and students from culturally diverse backgrounds.

Clark College enrolls over 5000 FTE students in a variety of transfer and technical disciplines, taught by a full-time faculty of 146 augmented by an outstanding part-time faculty drawn from the communities of Vancouver, Washington, and Portland, Oregon. Salaries and benefits are comparable with other colleges in the Pacific Northwest.

Summary Statement of Minority and Women Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) Outreach Program of the Portland HOME Consortium.

The City of Portland, City of Gresham and Multnomah County as members of the Portland HOME Consortium receive an annual entitlement grant under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development HOME Investment Partnership Program. This program provides funds for the development of affordable housing for low and moderate income households.

Consortium members will conduct direct outreach to certified MBE/WBE companies to inform them of contracting opportunities. For HOME contracts over \$10,000, Consortium members will advertise in minority media and register plans at plan centers.

The bulk of contracting will be carried out by recipients who are property owners involved in housing development projects. All HOME recipients will be provided lists of certified MBW/WBEs, be required to include language encouraging general contractors to use MBE/WBE subs, and be required to report on their accomplishments. Additionally, HOME recipients of sums over \$100,000 will be required to publish bid requests in minority media and register specifications at appropriate plan centers.

The Consortium will prepare an annual report and assessment on outreach efforts.
