House of Ujema Salutes Minority Business

"Faces of America"

"Faces of America," a one-person show that addresses the questions of multiculturalism, will be presented Thursday, Oct. 9, at 8 p.m. in Melrose Auditorium at Linfield College.

The program, which is free and open to the public, is sponsored by the Office of Multicultural Programs, Linfield Activities Board and Academic Advising.

"Faces of America" addresses the question of multiculturalism in today's society through the eyes of Generation X. The play presents eight characters all based on true stories researched through workshops and interviews with high school and college age populations. The eight characters depicted each represent a different cultural aspect of American society.

"Faces of America," written and directed by Colin Cox and starring Fran de Leon, was created in response to demands for diversity workshops. Recognizing that their strengths lay in the theatre, Cox and de Leon began an intensive research of young Americans. After interviewing more than 60 people, they began to formulate the characters depicted in this extraordinarily truthful portrayal of American society.

The program premiered at the Los Angeles Theatre Center in March 1995. It has since appeared at Pepperdine University, the University of Puget Sound, the University of Southern California, the National Association of Foreign Student Administrators, Colgate University and Cornell University.

As an actor, de Leon has worked with several noted theatre companies. Her theatre credits include Aramis in "The Three Musketeers," Puck in "A Midsummer Night's Dream" and Carolyn Babbitt in "A Woman's Hand." As a solo performer she has toured extensively throughout the United States with "Playfair," a specially designed interactive student program.

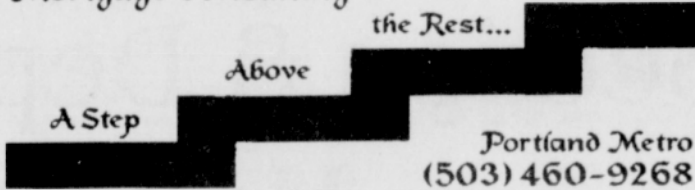

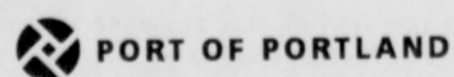

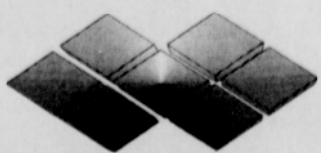
