Tom Jacobsen, a Baptist pastor is one of the fortunate ones. In 1994, he received a new heart that saved his life. Because of an anonymous and generous donor family, he is able to practice his ministry.

The Oregon Donor Program is a non-profit organization that save lives by promoting awareness, acceptance and understanding of the value and need for organ and tissue donation.

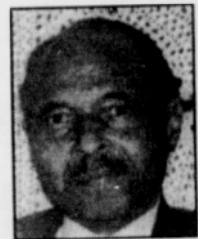
