Bishop Expresses Gratitude For Efforts on Behalf of Measure 51

Bishop Kenneth Steiner, Administrator of the Archdiocese of Portland, has expressed his gratitude to all those who lent their time, effort and support for Measure 51. He also pledged that the Catholic Church with its "resources, the faith of its people, the Catholic Health Care System, the involvement of its members in social and charitable services" would continue to "serve the needs of all Oregonians."

Reflecting on the campaign, Bishop Steiner noted that some individuals "tried to divide us, brother against sister, child against parent, younger against

elder, one faith community against another." He summed up the reason for the Church's involvement in this issue as being because "we believe strongly in the sacredness of human life, and the dignity and rights that flow from our human nature. We believe in the sanctity of life for each person, especially the unwanted and unloved, the handicapped, the vulnerable, the poor, the disadvantaged, the lonely, the frail, the weak, the helpless --- unbeliever as well as believer, unchurched as well as those with a faith-community --- for we are one, one family under God."

Bishop Steiner noted that much of the debate in the campaign related to an individual's "right to choose." He stated that "we believe strongly in freedom, in the free will God has given to all alike, of the sacred rights that we have, of our ability to make decisions and choices. But freedom and free will have consequences. Rights and choices are limited by the rights and choices of others. There is an objective norm of morality. Moral relativism does not mean that we are free to write our own code of morality from one age to the next. Our rights are limited by the rights of

others and by the common good."

Bishop Steiner assured Oregonians that the Catholic Church will "continue to proclaim the Gospel in work and action --- through our Catholic educational system, our Catholic health care system, our social service agencies, our Catholic parishes, ministering to all Oregonians regardless of creed or race."

He continued that throughout the campaign "we believed. We hoped. We loved. We prayed. If we can be faulted for anything, then let it be said that we were faithful to our call as human beings."
