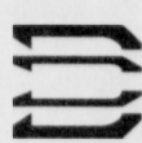

Pacific Power Sponsors Belize Trip

High school students with imagination could find themselves in Belize next summer. As part of the third annual Bound for Belize contest sponsored by Pacific Power, an essay question asks students to imagine they are in Kyoto, Japan, at the U.N. Framework Convention on Climate Change.

They would present their approach to reducing emissions of carbon dioxide and other heat-trapping greenhouse gases to representatives of more than 165 nations at the December meeting.

Their answer, coupled with a description of their activities to improve the environment, are the bases for which four students will be selected to attend a week-long Tropical Forest Ecology Course in the Central American country of Belize next June. In addition, one science teacher will be selected to journey with the students.

Bound for Belize winners will stay at a research station in the rain forest and participate in a course that includes botany field work, visits to Mayan ruins, flora and fauna identification and an opportunity to learn about the Belizean culture. They will learn about the importance tropical rain forests play in local, regional and global environments.

According to Sheila Holden, General Business Manager, Pacific Power created the contest to add value to its environmental work in Belize. In November 1995, the company, along with the Nature Conservancy and four other U.S. utilities, joined forces to tackle an environmental challenge that knows no boundaries - reducing greenhouse gas emissions in the global atmosphere.

The project is managed by the Programme for Belize, a private forest management and preservation organization that promotes conservation of Belize's

natural resources. The project includes preserving 15,000 acres of endangered rain forest and managing another 120,000 acres for environmental and economic gain.

"The company has been testing strategies to address carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions since 1992," Holden said. "Because trees soak up CO2 naturally, protecting trees in Belize helps balance the CO2 emitted by cars, coal-fired power plants and other industries thousands of miles away. Rain forests are truly global equalizers."

Holden said Pacific Power believes that by providing young scholars and their teachers an opportunity to explore one of the world's most unspoiled ecosystems, they will gain a better understanding of why it's important to adopt a global approach in addressing the earth's environmental challenges.

The company sent eligible high

schools Bound for Belize contest packets this week. Each school may select two student finalists. Finalist's applications are due March 12, 1998. Each finalist will receive a Bound for Belize T-shirt.

A panel of community leaders and environmental experts will choose four students, an alternate and one teacher. Winners will be announced by April 20, 1998, and they will attend the Tropical

Forest Ecology Course in late June. The course is taught by the Programme for Belize. A chaperone will accompany the students.

In 1996, then Jefferson High School senior, Sarah LePage, was a Bound for Belize winner. Pacific Power, along with Utah Power, is a PacificCorp company, providing energy services and products to approximately 2 million retail customers in the United States and Australia.

Police Make Arrest In Homicide Investigation

Portland Police Bureau Detectives have located and charged Tuan Van Tran in the October 25, 1997, shooting death of 23-year-old Kiet Truong.

The victim was fatally shot that October evening at NE 67th and Sandy Boulevard.

Tran was located and arrested by

Travis County Texas Sheriff's deputies in conjunction with the Austin, Texas, Police Department, Friday evening at approximately 7:30 PM.

Portland Police Detectives have interviewed Tran and pending extradition he will be transported back to Oregon.

Missing 10-Year-Old Girl Found Safe

Gateway Fred Meyer

Missing 10-year-old Jacqueline Renne Alley and 15-year-old runaway Tanya Sue Pace were recognized and placed into custody by Gateway Fred Meyer security officers at 2:45 Sunday afternoon. Jacqueline Alley has been reunited with her family this evening.

Fred Meyer security officers

called Portland Police after recognizing the two girls from the recent media attention. They were observed walking about the Gateway area store when contacted. Portland Police officers arriving on the scene recognized the two teenage boys and the stolen mountain bikes they were believed to have been

riding, just outside the Fred Meyer store. Both boys were placed into custody.

Portland Police detectives have interviewed all subjects involved in this investigation. It appears that Alley traveled with this group of her own free will. She did not appear to have been harmed and has

been returned to the custody of her parents.

Tanya Pace is being held until parental intervention on a runaway report. 17-year-old's Dustin Gassman and Corey Young have been charged with Theft 1, in connection with the stolen mountain bikes, valued at \$1,000 dollars.
