SE Portland Man Dies In Stolen Car Incident

At approximately 11:45 p.m., Wednesday, January 14, 1998, a SE Portland man died and a second man was injured when a speeding driver in a stolen vehicle rammed the victim's Chevrolet Nova at the intersection of SE 34th and SE Belmont.

William B. Hoge, white male, DOB 07-22-66, of SE Portland died as the result of injuries incurred when his 1970 Chevrolet Nova was struck in the rear while he was stopped at the light on SE Belmont at SE 34th Avenue. A passenger, Velester E. Magee, male black, DOB 06-12-68, of NE Portland was also injured. Magee is recovering from his injuries at a local hospital.

A Portland Police Officer observed two stolen vehicles parked in the lot of the Grand Central Bowl bowling alley in lower SE Portland. As he attempted to gather additional officers to the scene the suspects returned to the vehicles and drove off. He radioed the information to the other cars and followed the suspects. The stolen 1996 Chevrolet Blazer was following a stolen 1994 Mitsubishi Eclipse. Both vehicles had been stolen earlier in the evening by the suspects when both vehicles were discovered parked in front of con-

venience stores with the keys inside and the engines running.

At approximately SE 23rd and Belmont officers attempted to box-in the Blazer while it was traveling at a slow rate of speed. This failed when the suspect veered his vehicle into one of the police cars and accelerated to a high rate of speed and continued eastbound on SE Belmont. The officers became involved in a pursuit situation with overheads and sirens running for approximately five blocks when the lead car pulled off of the pursuit. The officer radioed ahead to other cars that the suspect was continuing eastbound without lights and that the officer was pulling back. The police car was stopped at the light at SE Belmont and 30th Avenue when he observed a flash of light and what appeared to be an accident. In the 3400 block of SE Belmont the Blazer had sideswiped a Honda Civic and a Toyota Celica before hitting the victim's car.

The Nova was driven by the impact of the collision into a nearby utility pole causing fatal injuries to the victim. The air bag in the stolen Blazer deployed preventing further injuries to the suspect.

William Arnold Tindell, white

male, DOB 02-02-79, was arrested and transported to a local hospital for treatment. He's charged with Manslaughter I, Assault II, Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle, UUMV, Felony Elude, Felony Hit & Run, Reckless Driving and Conspiracy to UUMV. Several hours later Ryan Christopher Moreland was arrested and charged with 2-counts of UUMV and 2-counts of Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle. Moreland was the driver of the stolen Mitsubishi vehicle. Both have been lodged into the Justice Center Jail. Both also have a history for UUMV.

Development planning for Neighborhoods

Vancouver's Community Development Department invites representative or recognized city neighborhoods to attend pre-application meetings regarding development proposals in their neighborhood. A pre-application meeting is the first meeting between the city and a potential developer. At these meetings, city staff inform the developer of require-

ments for development.

"By inviting neighborhood representatives, we hope to create an opportunity for the developer and neighborhood representatives to meet and create a working relationship," says Jon Wagner of the Community Development Department.

The city has already started noti-

fying recognized neighborhood associations of these meetings. The meeting notice includes the project name, location and description, and the name and telephone number of the city staff member responsible for the conference.

Historic Reserve looks for memories/mementos

Vancouver's National Historic Reserve hopes folks in the community who have memories and/or mementos from the early days will share them for the O.O. Howard House's grand opening this coming fall.

The newly-restored house on Officers Row will be the home of the National Historic Reserve Visitors Information Center. In preparation for the opening, an exhibit is planned to display many historic photos, documents and artifacts from the National Historic Reserve's collection.

"We need help from the public to

identify people, places and things in the collection," says Lois Mark, a historian working on the project.

In particular, she hopes to make contact with people who have personal recollection and/or photos of Vancouver Barracks, Pearson Field and Kaiser Shipyard.

Mack poses the following questions to help people jog their memory:

* Were you or an ancestor stationed at Vancouver Barracks prior to World War II?

* Did you or someone you knew fly out of Pearson Field before WW II?

* Did you work in the Kaiser Shipyard during WW II? Or did you live in Vancouver Housing Authority accommodations during the war?

* Did you see the Russian pilots land at Pearson Field in 1937? Do you have photographs of the event?

* Were you involved with Civilian Conservation Corps work in the Vancouver Barracks district?

* Do you have photos, scrapbooks, letters, diaries, souvenirs or other materials relating to any of the above subjects?
