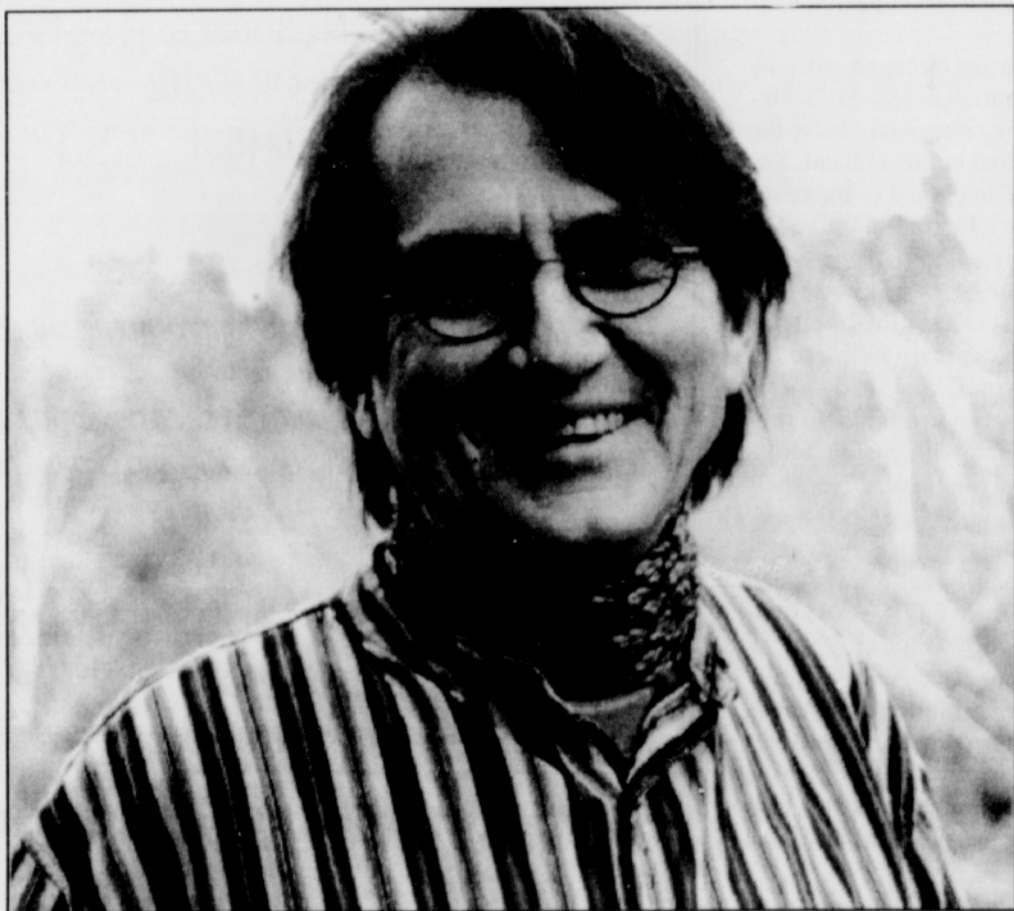
Ebony's Hottest Couples

Vincent McDermott to Present Retirement Concerts

Vincent McDermott, professor of music at Lewis & Clark College, will cap his 20-year career at the college with a pair of concerts showcasing his music and the compositions of eight of his former students.

The concerts are Friday, Feb. 6, 8 p.m., in Evans Auditorium, and Saturday, Feb. 7, 8 p.m. in Agnes Flanagan Chapel, Lewis & Clark College, 0615 S.W. Palatine Hill Road. Admission is free.

Performers include Lewis & Clark students, faculty, visiting

composers, the Oregon Repertory singers, and leading, local music professionals. Alumni composers will travel from as far as Korea, New York and Hawaii to be part of the concerts.

"My students and the College have given life to my own artistic productivity," said McDermott, who will perform selections of his work composed from 1970 to the present. "I want to share my music and my students' music as a capstone to my years at Lewis & Clark."

The programs will feature opera

scenes, chamber music, choral music, world music and electronic music.

"The concerts will cover nearly every genre of musical styles," said Gil Seemly, James W. Rogers professor of Music and chair of Lewis & Clark's music department. "They will show the breadth and the diversity of our graduates. Vincent encouraged his students to develop their own style. Music composition has become a vital aspect of our music program thanks to Vincent."
