Pat McDonnell named Deputy City Manager

Vancouver City Manager Vernon E. Stoner announced today that Clark County Administrator Pat McDonnell has been selected as Vancouver's new Deputy City Manager. McDonnell, who has served as county administrator since 1991, will assume his new position with the city on March 30.

"I took forward to having Pat come on board," Stoner says. "He brings strong skills to the position and will help us be successful in carrying out our mission and vision."

McDonnell, who will join Mary Jo Briggs as Vancouver's second deputy city manager, was selected from a nationwide field of candidates. His specific assignments and areas of responsibility will be announced later.

As Clark County administrator, McDonnell was responsible for planning, directing and managing county operations, services and activities. He is credited with shepherding the county through an era of unprecedented growth while implementing innovations in such areas as land

use planning, budgeting and strategic planning, inter-jurisdictional relations and social services.

He served as assistant Clark County administrator from 1987 to 1991 and was county administrator of Blue Earth County, Minnesota, from 1979 to 1987. McDonnell is a graduate of Mankato State University in Minnesota and has a masters degree in public administration/urban studies from Mankato State and Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Oregon.

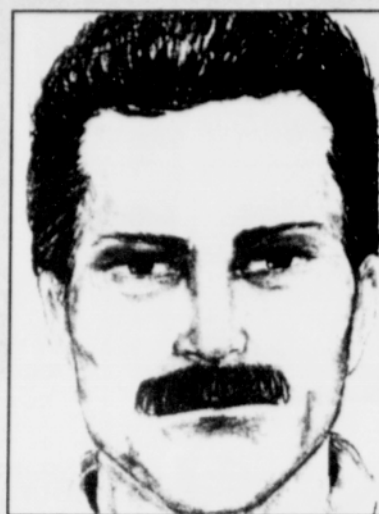

Crime Stoppers Residential Burglary

Portland Police, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, are asking for your help in identifying and apprehending a subject involved a residential burglary where the victim was at home.

On Thursday, February 5, 1998, at approximately 7:35 in the morning, in a ground floor apartment in the 2200 block of NE Flanders Street, a burglar entered through a window which awakened the female occupant. When the woman screamed, the suspect fled leaving behind a gray T-shirt.



The suspect is described as a male white, 25 to 35 years of age, 5'10" to 6'0" tall, approximately 200 pounds, with a thick full head of hair and a moustache. At the time he was wearing a brown leather jacket, jeans, white cloth gloves, and indicated he had a knife.

Officer Kim Keist Goes Home Saturday, February 28, 1998

Injured Portland Police Bureau Officer Kim Keist was released from Emanuel Hospital Saturday afternoon. Keist, has been in the Hospital recovering from gunshot wounds she received on January 27, 1998. The

same incident took the life of Portland Police Officer Colleen Waibel and injured Sgt. Jim Hudson.

Although Officer Keist has additional recovery and surgeries needed, she has been deemed well enough to

return home. The Keist family and the members of the Portland Police Bureau would like to thank everyone for the kindness shown during these trying times. The family requests no visitors in order to allow Kim to rest.

Suspect Charged In 1992 Double Homicide

Portland Police detectives and the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office have charged and indicted Sebastian Alexander Shaw, male Asian, Date of Birth November 28, 1967, in connection with two cases stemming from crimes committed in 1992 and 1995.

Shaw has been indicted for the July 17th 1992, stabbing murders of Todd A. Rudiger, 27 years, and his girlfriend Donna G. Ferguson, 18 years. The victim of a sexual assault

during the incident.

Shaw is also indicted for the Attempt Murder and Sexual Assault of a 22 year-old SE Portland/Richmond Neighborhood woman on June 1, 1995. The victim, who was beaten and tied up at gunpoint, fought with her assailant for over 20 minutes to escape further injury.

Portland Police Detectives M. Staulman and J. Boccia were assigned to the case after additional leads surface and links were made to connect both cases.

The victims in Tuesday night's homicide have been identified as: Barbara J. Gilpin, white female, DOB 11-12-53, of Seaside, Oregon and Jacqueline J. Anderson, white female, DOB 10-18-68, also of Seaside, Oregon.

The victims are believed to

have been shot to death by Eric Walter Running, AKA: Walter Denning, male Indian, 47 years, long black hair, 5' 10", 160 pounds. Running has a lengthy criminal record.

Running has not yet been located.

Community Notification of a Registered Sex Offender

The Portland Police Bureau is notifying the community of a Registered Sex Offender living in the 5600 block of S.E. Mitchell Street. ORS.181.588 allows law enforcement agencies to release such information to the public regarding convicted offenders, who are required to register, when such information will increase public awareness and promote community safety.

The Sex Offender has been convicted of a sex offense that requires he register with a law enforcement agency in Oregon. His criminal history places him in a category which indicates he

may reoffend. This subject is not wanted by the police at this time.

Subject's name is Allen Bryce Thompson, M.W., 39 years old, 6'1", 235, brown hair and hazel eyes.

Allen Thompson has been convicted of Sex Abuse III and is no longer under supervision. Thompson's victim was a 12 year old male who was a member of the Boy Scouts.
