ENTERTAINMENT Morris Day & The Time

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A Mega-Ego sized "M" monogrammed on every flashy jacket, and his cocky gimmickry earned talented vocalist Morris Day glaring spotlight -- in front of a gang of musical side-kicks dubbed The Time. Morris Day and his quirky accompanists have carved out a sizable cult following over the past two decades as purveyors of catchy, contagious, multilayered funk.

Under Morris' whimsical creative license the bunch quickly landed a recording contract with Warner Brothers Records, and cut their smash debut-album, The Time -- where jovial Morris showcased his worth as more than just an animated musician, also directing the album's production and performance output.

A marketer's dream -- Morris has demonstrated a longevity that wasn't necessarily intentional. Morris Day's rarefied musical style marked the 80's with trademark comical skits, trendsetting stagegadgetry, and dance and R&B

chartbursters like The Walk, 777-9311, Oaktree, and Fishnet.

A scene-stealing supporting role in lifelong pal Prince's Oscar-winning flick Purple Rain, further exhibited Morris' natural born inclination to act -- be it on stage or the big screen

The 1991 reunion of Morris Day and The Time yielded Pandemonium - further symbolizing the group's

enduring lure -- and so marked the next millennium's diagnosed supersized case of Morris-mania.

"We're back!", proclaims Morris. And, the if it's not broke don't fix it' adage seems to apply. The group resurrected in classic style, with Morris and three of The Time's original members in tow: Jerome "Mirror Man" Benton, Jelly Bean Johnson, and Monty Moir.

Milli Vanilli **Star Pilatus Found Dead**

Rob Pilatus, half of pop duo Milli Vanilli, has been found dead in a Frankfurt hotel room, Germany's Bild am Sonntag newspaper said Sunday, quoting the artist's ex-manager.

Pilatus was found dead on his hotel bed Friday evening with blood around his nose and mouth. Doctors at the scene diagnosed heart failure.

Police were unable to confirm the report. A spokesman said they would be informed of a death only if circumstances had been suspicious.

Milli Vanilli's former manager Frank Farian told Bild am Sonntag that Pilatus had just come out of drug rehabilitation.

Pilatus was born in New York, but grew up with adoptive parents in Munich, where he was expected to be buried.
