## HOMICIDE

Portland Police Homicide Investigators, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, are asking for your help in identifying and apprehending suspects in a murder.

On Wednesday, May 28, 1997, at approximately 3:30 in the morning, 34 year old **Wendy Kay Lim** and a male companion were sitting in a parked car at N Albina Avenue and N Webster Street, when a white mid-sized American car, occupied by two black males, approached westbound on Webster,



pulled alongside Lim's vehicle and fired numerous

shots, fatally wounding **Lim** and injuring her companion. The suspect vehicle then sped from the scene westbound on Webster.

Investigators are still attempting to determine the motive for the shooting.

## Detectives Ask for Publics Help

### Information Regarding Robbery/Rape Suspect

On February 24, 1998, **Russell Gerald Harris** was arrested by Portland Police Detectives in connection with **two Robbery and Sexual Assault** investigations. The cases occurred between November of last year and February of 1998. One of his victims was picked up on 82nd Avenue near Stark

and the other on NE Sandy near SE 87th Avenue. In each of the cases the victims were female and had previous histories relating to prostitution. The suspect vehicle description is not being released at this time.

**Harris**, a white male, DOB 6-1-68, 5'4", 150 pounds, red hair and blue eyes, has previ-

ous arrests for Sexual Abuse I, Theft II, and Forgery II. Investigators believe that Harris may be linked to additional assaults against women. Anyone who has information relating to crimes committed by Harris are asked to call **Portland Police Detective Al Smith** at 823-0400.

## Police Memorial Service

### Tom McCall Waterfront Park

On Tuesday, May 12, 1998, the Portland Police bureau honored its fallen Officers with a Memorial Service. The location was the Portland Police Memorial, located near the west end of the Hawthorne Bridge in Tom McCall Waterfront Park. The service was in connection with National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Week, which honors fallen federal, state, and local Law Enforcement Officers who

have died in the line of duty. President John F. Kennedy signed the bill in 1961, which established the Memorial Week. May 15th was also designated as Peace Officers Memorial Day.

Assistant Chief Dave Butzer was the Master of Ceremonies. Portland Mayor Vera Katz, Police Chief Charles Moose and others were speakers during the program. A Lighting of the Candle was presented by the

Portland Police Roses to begin the ceremony.

Presentation of Medals by the Military Order of the Purple Heart and a presentation to Vicki Jeffries of an award winning poem written about Officer Thomas Jeffries by Oregon State Trooper Monty Ritchey was the highlight.

The Portland Police Association (PPA) announced a new educational scholarship program which has been created.

He has earned the trust and votes of District 2. We know he will serve Multnomah County with integrity, compassion, and leadership.

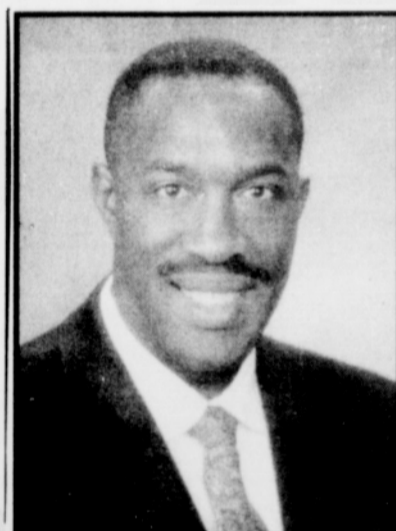
