## Minimal oral feedings may help premature infants

Feeding premature infants a specific amount of nutrients orally may help their digestive systems develop properly, according to preliminary findings from new studies done on neonatal animals.

Researchers at the USDA/ARS Children's Nutrition Research Center and the department of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston assessed the intestinal nutrient needs and then compared intravenous and minimal oral feeding in neonatal animals.

"Our studies showed that the neonatal intestine has a much higher requirement for protein than for carbohydrate," said Dr. Douglas Burrin, a USDA/ARS research physiologist. "We found giving neonatal pups up to 30% of nutrients orally helped their digestive systems grow properly. We hope this finding will one day help neonatologists determine the optimum composition and volume of oral feedings to give premature infants."

"We believe premature infants will one day benefit from this finding," said Burrin.

"Using minimal oral feeding to supplement intravenous feeding can improve weight gain, shorten hospital stays, and help premature infants learn how to suck and swallow much faster."
