## Anchorage resident Sienna Horton receives top honors

Lewis & Clark College honored Sienna Horton of Anchorage, Alaska, with its Rena J. Ratte Award, the College's top academic honor.

A 1998 graduate of Lewis & Clark, Horton majored in history with a minor in Latin American studies and a concentration in art.

"Grades don't reflect total mastery. It's not ornamental honors that are important. It's developing relationships with professors and knowing what a grade stands for. At Lewis & Clark, I had amazing professor," Horton says. "I enjoy the thrill of studying an issue, trying to understand it and putting it in historical context."

Horton attended Stellar Secondary School, an alternative school in Anchorage, where students written evaluations of their work instead of letter grades.

"The highlight of my academic life so far was meeting Icabod Flewellen. The elderly historian with his shock of 'Don King-hair,' trench coat and briefcase jammed with historical documents, cut an impressive figure," Horton recalls. "My initial curiosity over his eccentric, stooped appearance gave way to sheer awe when I realized

vice was inspiring."

Horton hopes to combine her love of historical research with art and to pursue a career as a public historian or an archivist for a museum.

## Images of Africa: Summer Festival of African Films at PCC Cascade

Images of Africa: Summer Festival of African Films at PCC Cascade will be held on the Cascade Campus of Portland Community College, 705 North Killingsworth, in Terrell Hall, Room 122. The festival will run for ten weeks, from June 25 to August 27, with screenings on Thursdays at 12 noon.

The popular comedies will be among the festival highlights. On July 9, *La Vie Est Belle (Life is Rosy)* stars the legendary Zairian pop singer, Papa Wemba, in an upbeat rags to riches story set in Kinshasha, Congo/Zaire. On July 23, *Gito the Ungrateful*, the first feature film from Burundi, follows Gito's hilari-

ous misadventures upon his return to Burundi after years of studying abroad.

On July 16, summer filmgoers will have the rare opportunity to view *Harvest 3,000 Years*, an early film by Haile Gerima, best known for his recent film *Sankofa*. This beautiful and compelling film dramatizes the story of a peasant family struggling to survive in the face of Ethiopia's feudal system.

Among the summer lineup are three films that have never been shown before at the Cascade Festival of African Films, PCC's annual African film event in February. On July 2, *Saaraba (Utopia)*, a film from

Senegal examines each character's misguided search for *saaraba* or "utopia." On August 13, *Quartier Mozart*, a highly original film from Cameroon, tells about a young schoolgirl whom a local sorceress helps enter a young man's body so she can see for herself the real "sexual politics" of the neighborhood. *Mapantsula*, hailed as the first anti-apartheid feature film by, for, and about black South Africans, will end the summer festival on August 27.

## Jefferson Students Dance On with Grant from PGE-Enron Foundation

The PGE-Enron Foundation announced today it has awarded the Jefferson Dance program a one-time only grant in the amount of \$45,508 to ensure the continuation of the nationally acclaimed dance program into the 1998-99 school year.

Due to cuts in school funding and a renewed commitment to academic excellence, the Jefferson principal recently announced she had no other recourse than to cut this outstanding program arts program. After reading about the situation, Foundation chair Gwyneth Gamble Booth proactively approached interim superintendent Diana Snowden about finding a solution to Jefferson's dilemma.

The Foundation's grant will restore the program to its full potential while allowing Jefferson time to find stable funding in the future. Students and parents have vowed to seek additional funding to support the celebrated program beyond the upcoming school year.

"This grant does more than save a unique dance program for gifted dancers," says Gwyneth Gamble Booth, chair of the PGE-Enron Foundation. "It helps continue the sense of pride the Jefferson Dancers have instilled in the school, the community and the state. It would be a shame to lose it due to lack of funding."

Jefferson has agreed to maintain their FTE instructors while the Foundation's grant will provide funding to cover production costs, costumes, and costs associated with touring.

"The PGE-Enron Foundation has come to the rescue of the Jefferson Dancers," said Diana Snowden, interim superintendent for Portland Public Schools. "Their generosity has given us some breathing room to work with parents and the community on finding stable resources to fund the program."

The mission of the PGE-Enron Foundation focuses on improving the quality of life for all Oregonians by supporting programs and services that promote healthy families, provide educational opportunities, clean up and preserve the environment, encourage the arts and cultural diversity and revitalize Oregon communities. Since Enron and Portland General Electric merged in July, 1997, both companies have contributed \$10 million each to the Foundation, increasing its assets to \$25 million.
