tion Plan adds that the first story is the least historically or architecturally significant part of the building. With eight foot ceilings and housing utility and service facilities, it was "essentially an above-ground basement," he says. "We can construct an exact duplicate, with ten foot ceilings, for less than the cost of moving," he says.

Not that this will be cheap. According to Myers-Eatwell, Friesen's

first estimate of the moving cost is \$1.4-1.5 million, up from an earlier guess of \$.6 to 1.2 million. However, the new estimate, and a projected \$3 million for renovation and conversion on site, would still be less than the \$5-6 million the bureau proposed to spend for a smaller facility.

The 1916 building was once the headquarters of the Swift meat packing company operations, which developed most of the Kenton neighborhood as a company town.

clothes policeman who observed the entire drama. Noticing how upset she was, he followed her to her car, and told her that she had been discriminated against. He gave her his number in case she needed a witness. In March, 1997, the complainant filed with the bureau alleging race discrimination in public accommodation. The plainclothes policeman later testified at the administrative hearing in April, 1998.

In the Final Order, the commis-

sioner writes that the battle against race discrimination has been on the "front line of civil rights. Discrimination in public accommodation impairs a person's right to move about freely in society and to be recognized thereby as a part of his or her community." The bureau receives an average of 2,200 complaints of discrimination per year. Only 2 percent of these are public accommodation complaints; the others are complaints of discrimination in employment.

Utilities, Trade Associations Team Up With Portland Public Schools To Develop Trades Training Program At Jefferson

added, "We hope this program will help revitalize Jefferson." The Utility Trade Consortium Project is structured to provide students with a curriculum that is consistent with industry standards and gives them "real life" examples of how their learning of traditional subjects, such as math and science, applies to trade work. In addition, trades people will visit the classroom on a regular basis to share their skills and expertise and students will gain field experience by visiting various construction and utility work sites. Eventually, onsite work experiences will be developed for junior and senior students.

Another key component of the program is to make the transition from high school to apprenticeship programs, two-year training programs and four year colleges, as well as full time employment, easier for students. "Approximately 50% of craft workers in the utility industry will be eligible to retire in the next five years," says Kathy Treves, business partnerships manager at Portland Public Schools. "It is imperative that companies get involved now in

training the next generation of employees."

Organizations participating in the project include: Portland General Electric, Pacificorp, Northwest Natural, Bonneville Power Administration, Associated General Contractors, and C. Durham Construction, Inc.

After completing a three to five year trade apprenticeship, students will have the potential to earn an annual salary of \$42,000. In comparison, the annual salary for a first year teacher with a five year master's degree employed by Portland Public School is \$29,800.

"Companies are seeing school-to-work programs as part of their strategic human resources plan," says Dick O'Connor, Associated General Contractors school-to-work consultant and executive director of the Oregon Building Congress. "We need well trained qualified workers to ensure the future success of our industry. By working together with Portland Public Schools, we can provide the curriculum, resources and standards need to educate and train young men and women who want to enter high paying trade careers."
