## Winnie The Pooh Is The Treat This Halloween

The Emmy Award-winning "Boo! To You Too, Winnie The Pooh" makes its ABC debut on Halloween night, Saturday, October 31st at 8 PM (ET/PT).

The Emmy Award-winning "Boo! To You Too, Winnie The Pooh" premiered on CBS in 1996 to both critical acclaim in all key demographics, and outdelivering all competition in both Kids 2-11 and Adults 18-49. This is the first time "Boo! To You Too, Winnie The Pooh" will air on ABC after just one appearance on CBS.

The one-hour special is comprised of a 22-minute Pooh story, complimented by Halloween-themed classic cartoon shorts from The Walt Disney Studios vaults featuring Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. "Boo! "Boo! To You Too, Winnie The Pooh" opens with Pooh and his pals readying themselves for the "Bestest Halloween ever" - but timid Piglet is too terrified of goblins to join in the fun. When Pooh and company are thrown into an exciting adventure on a particularly dark and stormy Halloween night, Piglet finds his courage, Tigger gets the good scare he



was hoping for, and they all learn a lesson about friendship and the benefits of sticking together in the face of fear.

The TV special features an stellar talent roster, including Jim Cummings as the voice of both Winnie the Pooh and Tigger: John Fiedler as Piglet; Peter Cullen as Eeyore; Michael Gough as Gopher; Ken

Sansom as Rabbitt; Andre Stojka as Owl; and John Rhys Davies serves as the narrator.

"Booh! To You Too, Winnie The Pooh" is a production of Walt Disney Television Animation, and Rob LaDuca is Producer/Director of the TV special. Sharon Morrill is Executive Vice President, Walt Disney Television Animation.


## World Championship Boxing:

An exciting doubleheader of world-class actions in the offing as four of the fiercest prizefighters on the planet do battle Halloween night on the live HBO Sports exclusive WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP BOX-ING: PRINCE NASEEM HAMED VS. A native of Sheffield, England, Prince Naseem Hamed (30-0, 28 KOs) made his scintillating U.S. debut last Dec. 19 when he knocked out gutty challenger Kevin Kelley in the fourth round before a roaring Madison Square Garden crowd.

A native of Belfast, Ireland, Wayne McCulllough (22-1, 14 KOs), a former world champ in the bantamweight division, will move up to 126 pounds to challenge Hamed. McCullough, 28, is known as "The Pocket Rocket" and is a fierce fighter who will try to upset his unorthodox opponent.

The co-feature showcases a pair of 122-pounders in a world junior featherweight title bout. Reigning champion Vuyani Bungu (35-2, 18 KOs), of East London, South Africa, will defend his belt against Danny Romero (32-2, 28 KOs), of Albuquerque, NM. Bungu, 31, has twice beaten the formidable Kennedy McKinney and is ranked No. 1 in KO magazine's listing of the world's top junior featherweights.
