"This has been such a great week for me," Agassi said after defeating Slovakia's Jan Kroslak 6-2, 3-6, 6-3 Sunday to capture the Czech Indoor and pocket \$137,000.

### Moves off hard Salary Cap

Despite the different spin from different people, it was clear that the sides were moving away from confrontation and toward compromise.

On the most productive day of negotiations in the NBA lockout, owners backed off their insistence on having a hard salary cap.

Players and owners met for about nine hours Monday on Day 118 of the lockout, and finally started talking in detail about a compromise.

"We need a system that eventually gets to where there's a set percentage for the players and a set percentage for the owners," deputy commissioner Russ Granik said. "I don't think it has to be a hard cap, and in fact some of the things we're talking about now are not hard caps."

The owners' shift in position was

downplayed by the union, but it meant the sides have to be closer, at least in principle, on coming to an agreement on the main economic issues.

Talks resumed today with the sides discussing non-economic issues. On Wednesday, a negotiating session will covermany of the topics discussed Monday.

"The best thing is we have some sort of an agreement on basic principles," said Orlando center Danny Schayes, a member of the union's executive committee.

"Right now, we're talking about a hybrid system. The first couple of years itwouldworkone way, for another couple of years it would work another way if the first way didn't work. At least we're finding some common ground," Schayes said.

About 20 people from the union and

10 from the league worked through the afternoon and into the night at a Manhattan hotel. The site was kept a secret to avoid the circus atmosphere that has surrounded past negotiating sessions.

Most participants left after about 7{ hours, but a few members from each side, including commissioner David Sternand union director Billy Hunter, stayed late.

"There's not been any movement at all. We've got some difficulties. We've made little or no progress," Hunter said, contradicting statements made by others involved in the talks.

The league was asking to operate under a luxury tax system for the next three seasons, with a fallback system of a harder salary cap for the next three years. The union was asking for a tax system lasting two years, with the fallback system lasting another two years, Schayes said
