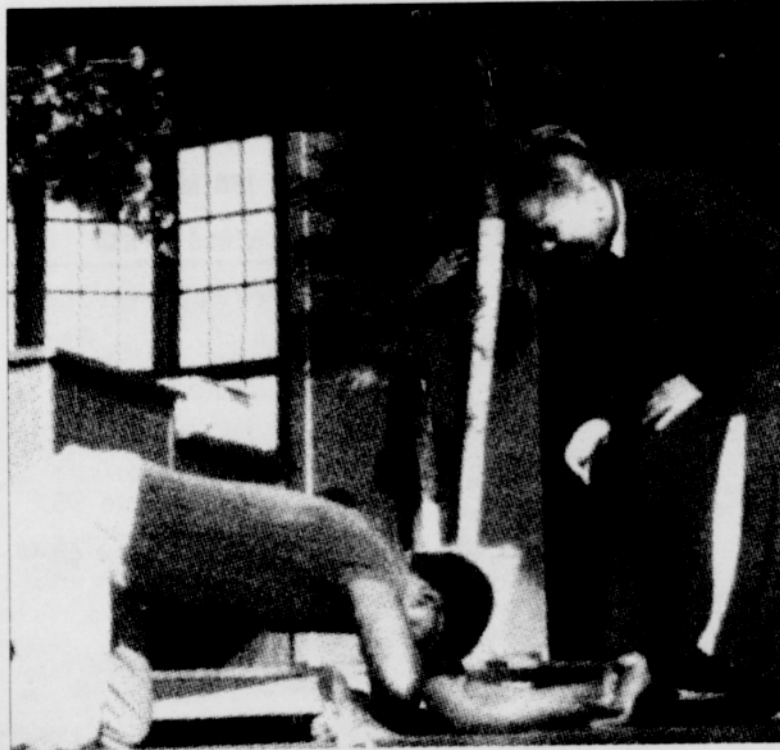

The Remarkable Story Of Samuel Bryant

As the descendant of an African slave and a native American woman, Samuel Bryant spent his early years picking cotton in the fields of Mississippi. Today, he stands proud as the owner of the only African-American art gallery in downtown Portland.

Samuel's journey from obscurity to success epitomizes the American dream. When his family moved to Portland, he attended Irvington Grade School and Grant High School then worked as a photographer for Bonneville Power Administration.

One afternoon, his life suddenly changed. While on assignment at the Nez Pierce Indian Reservation in Idaho, he went into a store to pick up a snack. An old Indian man was standing in a corner. Their eyes met and Samuel felt the old man looking into his soul. When Samuel turned to leave, the old man was gone. Half a dozen miles from the store, Samuel pulled over onto the shoulder of the highway, unable to continue. Waves of tears flooded down his cheeks and a voice spoke to him: 'Red Eagle, Red Eagle, you are Red Eagle.' The

voice spoke for what seemed like an eternity and when he looked up again, it was dark. He returned to Portland amazed by the experience. The inner vision remained with him and two years later, he realized that his destiny was bring the art and spirit of Africa to Portland through stone sculptures from Zimbabwe.

Everything fell into place and 'Red

Eagle Gallery' opened its doors on May 15, 1997. Not only is the gallery a place of astonishing beauty where visitors can feast their eyes on exquisitely carved visions of Africa, but it is a metaphysical sanctuary to heal and revitalize the soul. Samuel is a truly remarkable man whose story will inspire and encourage your readers.

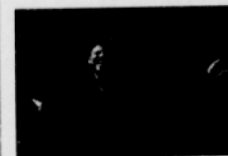
