Painting From The Source

Remember the joy you felt as a child when you finger-painted or watercolored and let your imagination run wild? Perhaps you drew vibrant flowers, animals or monsters. Did you know that you could experience that same artistic freedom by getting in touch with the creative source that's inside everyone?In the tradition of Drawing On the Right Side of the Brain and The Artist's Way, artist and therapist Aviva gold demonstrates how anyone can use painting as a means of ecstatic self-expression and personal transformation. In Painting From The Source: Awakening the Artist's Soul In Everyone(HarperPerrenial; Paperback), Gold, with co-author Elena Oumano, gently guides both novices and trained painter alike on a step-by-step journey toward self-knowledge.

"Every human being is an artist," says Gold. "As children, all of us lived and painted intuitively. Creativity is supposed to be easy, fun, enriching, life confirming, and joyous, with no anxiety and end results. Many of us are cut off from that effortless expression." Gold reminds us that we are our own worst critics and that we stifle our own creativity with intellectual doubts. In Painting From The Source, Aviva Gold, using artistic talent and her experience in psychotherapy, helps us to rediscover our creative side using a blend of spiritual, artistic, and psychological elements.

Gold helps us tap the "source" - the instinctual center in each of us. Once we reach the source she gives us hints on

staying with it while painting. Some things to keep in mind are:

·Paint absolutely anything you want -no matter how grotesque, pretty, corny, babyish, silly or obscene.

·Use all the paint you want-and take all the time you need.

·There are no restrictions - you can be as messy as you want, drip paint on the floor, mix any colors together, make the paper any size or shape, or hang it in any position.

Avoid listening to music while you paintat least in the beginning. Music exerts a powerfuleffectonyour entire system - from physical tomental, from spiritual to emotional.

·Stay indoors while you paint-at least until you are well- connected to the source.

Avoid interruptions - don't answer the phone, turn off the ringer and turn down the answering machine.

Painting From The Source will inspire the novice to put brush to paper, and help the experienced painter to rediscover the passion for painting that he or she might have lost.



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
