The Oregon Jewish Museum Opens With Photo Exhibit of Jewish Life

The Oregon Jewish Museum (OJM) opens its doors at its first public location with "Jews Germany Memory: Photographs by Edward Serotta, 1988-96," a portrait of Jewish life in Germany today.

The museum will host an open house 2 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., Sunday, Jan. 24 1999 at Montgomery Park Suite 715, 2701 NW Vaughn in Portland. At 3:00 p.m., during the opening reception, three local scholars will offer their insights about Jewish life in Germany today.

The museum will also host a First Thursday reception 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 4.

"Jews Germany Memory" will be on display at the Oregon Jewish Museum through Feb. 28. The museum is open noon to 3 p.m. Tuesdays Through Thursdays, and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Sundays. For more information, call the museum at 226-3600.

"The Oregon Jewish Museum was founded in 1989 by a volunteer group committed to providing Oregon with a museum of Jewish art and history," said Linda Laviolette, the museum's director. "We are delighted to finally have a location

with enough space to house exhibits as well as the museum's archives and office."

Over the past ten years, the Oregon Jewish Museum has produced 13 Jewish art and history exhibits at a variety of locations. In 1995, the Oregon Jewish Museum merged with the Jewish Historical Society of Oregon and moved its office and collection from private homes and businesses to space at the Oregon Historical Society.

In July 1998, the OJM Board of directors hired Laviolette as the museum's first director.
