Portland, OR - The Miracles Club (located on NE. Martin Luther King/Mason) is a nonprofit, social club for the "recovering" community and their family. It was opened in the early 1980's by a few men with the intent of providing a "clean and sober" space. As a shared commitment, they held each one accountable for staying off of addictive substances. Their gathering circle would openly share their strengths, support and hopes. It was in this kind of environment that fostered their healing and gave them the impetus to do the same for others.

The Miracles Club has been that for people – a place to unwind or gather as a family to put their lives in proper perspective as part of their socialization process. It is open daily and frequently attended by the members who are all in recovery. They are free to join an ongoing support group like Narcotics Anonymous that's conveniently offered on

site

Phillip Johnson of Northeast Portland is one devoted member whose life had been dramatically changed through The Miracles Club. He has successfully stayed drug and alcohol-free for 6 1/2 years. Phillip credits God and the support of those in The Miracles Club for his recovery. The dramatic turnaround for him occurred once he became a member. Phillip went from being "down and out" homeless to having his own home, running a successful lawn maintenance business and raising a fam-

The Miracles Club is holding fund-raiser events that are open to the public. They plan on hosting a comedy special, "Appollo Night" and "The Dating Game". Proceeds from these events go towards community programs that would further efforts in helping recovering addicts.
