This Is For You LORD

Reverend Jackie McCullough Returns To Her Homeland Jamaica To Lead Thousands Of Worshipers In An Unprecedented Live Recording Of Praise And Worship

In her beloved homeland of Jamaica, world-renowned Evangelist Rev. Jackie McCullough led over 5,000 enthusiastic worshipers in a dynamic live recording of preaching and praise for the new album, **This Is For You Lord**.

Recorded on an outdoor stage at The Church On The Rock, a natural rock-carved amphitheater, the album features a host of well-known talent, under the direction of acclaimed producer Kevin Bond.

Superstar Jamaican rapper Papa San, members from Kirk Franklin's The Family, Tamela Mann, Dalon Collins, LaKeisha Grandy and gospel singer Lawrence Matthews, along with a live band, joined Rev. McCullough as she encouraged her fellow Jamaicans in the Lord during an unforgettable evening of worship and the Word.

"I wanted to do an album that would take people into the presence of the Lord," says McCullough. "A place where people would actually feel comfortable, not intimidated, with God's supernatural presence. I want people to experience God and walk away with not just the peace of God, but a piece of God."

The album presents a soul-stirring collection of all original

songs, mostly penned by McCullough. "I write like I preach, so writing these songs was another form of preaching for me," says McCullough. That explains why the combination of song interspersed with encouraging exhortations and short spirit-filled sermonettes is so powerful: it's a double dose of Scripture.

From the house-infused grooves of "Nothing But Pleasure" to the crowd-pleasing reggae rhythms of "Be Connected," This Is For You Lord appeals to a wide spectrum of listeners.

To help pull it out of her head and onto the keyboard, McCullough called on collaborator George E. Hyman, Jr. The result is ten songs, written over the course of eight years, that reflect both the heart of her Christian experience and the message with which she encourages the Church.

The title of the album is especially significant for McCullough, who says, "This is absolutely for Him, because it's not for me, because I can't sing. And I think God has a sense of humor by giving me all of these songs and the spirit of the songs, and He knows I can't even sing one of them in public."

Kammerchor, the 50-voice, acapella choir from Concordia University Wisconsin, will perform a variety of "psalms, hymns and spiritual songs" on March 12th at 8 p.m. The public is invited to attend this free concert held at St. Michael's Lutheran Church at NE 29th and Dekum in Portland.

Saint Michael's is located near the Concordia campus and there is plenty of lighted, off-street parking. This is the first visit the Kammerchor has made to the Pacific Northwest. Kammerchor, led by director Kenneth T. Kosche, a prolific and well-known composer in Lutheran circles, offers a great sampler of choral art organized around the theme, "Psalms, Hymns and Spiritual Songs."

The psalms include Menelsohn's notable "Denn er hat seinen Engeln"

(He has given his angels charge over you). Kammerchor will also perform "Song for Athene" written by John Taverner.

This great hymn received world attention recently when it was sung at the funeral of Princess Dianna. The Kammerchor is proficient with many national styles, including an American Pennsylvania Dutch carol and the awesome Russian "Salvation is created" by Tchesnokoff with its deep sounding basses.

A set of lively and mournful spirituals also promise to warm the audience including "Deep River," "Ain't Got Time to Die" and "Goin' Home on a Cloud." Concordia University Wisconsin is a sister school to Portland's own Concordia University located in the Northwest.

They are members of the Concordia University System, a national network of ten Lutheran colleges and universities who are developing a model in collaboration and distance learning.
