Anyone who has seen Brenda Lee perform will attest to the fact that she has truly earned the nickname "Miss Dynamite". Small but mighty, this diminutive performer belts out an explosion of sound sending a charge of energy throughout the audience.

Rarely has a performer grown from childhood to maturity with the kind of sweeping momentum that has propelled this tiny fireball into a fourth decade of making music. By the age of six she was astounding listeners with a maturity of sound and interpretation of lyrics usually reserved for grown women. Before she reached twenty, Brenda Lee had attained the status of teen idol with million sellers "I'm sorry," "All Alone AM I," "Fool Number 1," "Emotions," "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree," and "That's All You Gotta Do."

With her international record sales in excess of 100 million copies, Brenda is credited with more double sided hit singles than any other women in

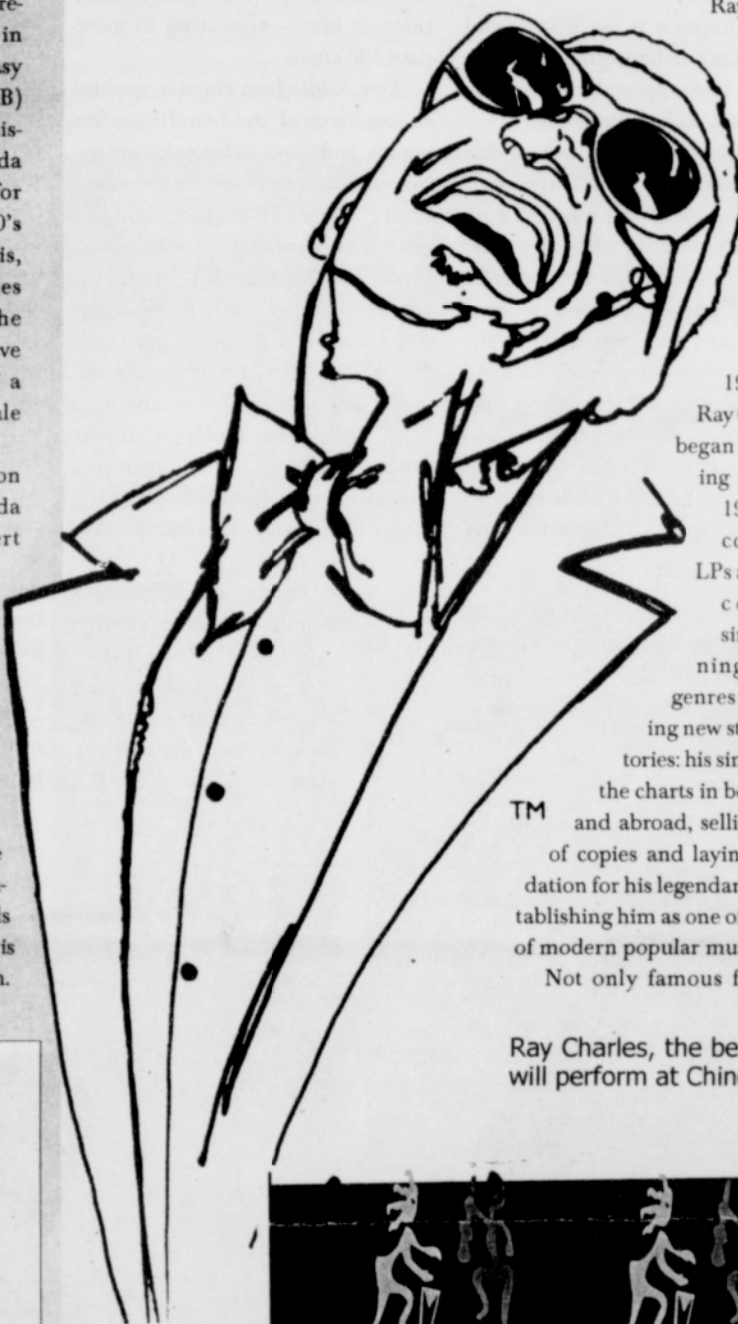
the history of pop music. Her recordings have hit the charts in more categories (pop, rock, easy listening, country and R&B) than any other female in the history of recorded music. Brenda is the top charted female act for the entire decade of the 1960's and fourth overall with Elvis, The Beatles and Ray Charles completing the top four. She ranks #9 in "Most Consecutive Top Ten Hits Of All Time," a category shared by both male and female artists.
