Streetcar Construction Underway



The first modern streetcar in the United States started construction April 5 with track installation connecting Portland State University (PSU) downtown Portland to Good Samaritan Hospital in Northwest Portland. To kick off the construction, City Commissioner Charlie Hales was joined by Congressmen Earl Blumenauer and David Wu, the Honorable Mark Hatfield, Portland Streetcar Inc. Board Chair Don Magnusen as well as over a hundred business owners and residents along the streetcar route.

The new streetcar will run on tracks from PSU north on 10th, west NW Northrup, south on 23rd, east on NW Lovejoy and then south on 11th back to PSU. The streetcar will boast 10-minute headways. Fares will be the same as Tri-Met and be transferable between the two transit providers. The streetcar will be fully operational early in 2001.
