The vision involves a relationship between individuals or groups seeking community, and Integrated Urban Habitats as coordinator/developer. IUH acquires building sites, wades through zoning and building ordinances, obtains construction financing and establishes the legal and financial basis necessary for the housing development. Individuals help design common facilities and dwellings. These communities evolve according tot he interests of the people involved, integrating into the plan respect for the nature of the land being built upon, the surrounding neighborhoods and many other factors.


The Integrated Urban Habitats endeavor is being advanced by Erroyl Hawley, an innovative and ecologically progressive urban builder/developer and Deborah Ham, a Realtor and personal growth consultant who has 25

and community has resulted in a promising future for intentional community in greater Portland.

There are social and economic advantages to uniting the interests of the prospective owners with the builder/ developer. Erroyl found his options as a builder/developer limited by what banks and lending institutions think the general public wants. Projects with "buyers waiting for the product" have much more flexibility and qualify for better financing, thus allowing for more of the community but were unable or unwilling to invest the amount of time and financial resources necessary to self-develop an ecological and community friendly project. They have the means to solve these problems.

Integrated Urban Habitats brings the professionals together with the people who desire a sense of community, and gets the community built. They handle the tedious, time consuming and potentially risky details of preliminary development. Three "community" sites have already been acquired, with development planning underway. Each site has already satisfied substantial jurisdictional criteria necessary for community development. This allows prospective owners to focus on designing the community

facilities and fine tuning site plans. Development planning will continue on these sites. The earlier a family makes purchase reservations (nonbuilding), the

Here's a brief synopsis of the sites currently being developed:

Gateway Commons: within the 102<sup>nd</sup> light rail system area in east Portland. Excellent public transportation, both bus and rail with easy highway connections. Affordably priced,

with current estimates at \$99,000 -\$130,000, depending on the amount of common/community space envisioned by the eventual purchasers.

SpringWater Commons: near the SpringWater Corridor between 113th & 122<sup>nd</sup> in SE Portland. Convenient bus transportation and highway connections. Very affordably priced between \$85,000 - \$110,000.


Walnut Park Commons: situated between Tigard and Beaverton amongst lovely trees, with a creek, pond and wetland habitat. Option for

upscale housing in a community context-subject to desires of purchasers.

All of these neighborhood sites provide opportunity for progressive environmental design. Solar and energy wise technology, healthy and sustainable materials, natural landscaping and natural resource preservation will all be incorporated into these projects. A variety of housing opportunities is anticipated including townhouses, flats, lofts and households, including couples, families with children, seniors and singles.

The current effort is to gather together people who seek more neighborly connection. Several presentation meetings are scheduled which will outline the vision, the time line, and information on how individuals, families or groups can become part of a vibrant, neighborhood friendly, sustainable community.
