Featuring ten life-size 9 foot panels depicting important people whose "Hopes and Dreams" personify mankind's never-ending quest for betterment, the Tour museum includes five large wall panels (1000-1450, 1450-1600, 1600-1800, 1800-1900, 1900-1950). Each panel highlights pivotal events and people from the time period, with the final wall highlighting the years from 1950 to the present and the "Hopes & Dreams Journal." The ten featured individuals are Leif Eriksson, Marco Polo, Joan of Arc, Leonardo da

Vinci, Ben Franklin, Abe Lincoln, Thomas Edison and Susan B. along with Martin Luther King Jr. and John F. Kennedy on the last wall. Each of the five large wall panels includes a "Did You Know? timeline including interesting facts and inventions which have impacted our world today, as well as quotes and images of an additional six noteworthy people from the

time period.
