## Inter-Faith Mother's Day Service Offers Healing Hope to Victims of Abuse and Their Families

Over 60 percent of Oregon women who are abused are mothers. In an effort to assist in the healing process of those who have suffered domestic violence, an interfaith Mother's Day service will be held Sunday, May 9 at 4 p.m. at the First Congregational Church of Christ, 1126 S.W. Park Avenue. The service is jointly sponsored by members of the Portland Interfaith Clergy Support Group and the Associate of Downtown Churches as part of an effort by Bradley-Angle House to raise public awareness about domestic violence. The service is open to anyone wishing to commemorate or honor women, children and families who have suffered domestic violence.

The service will be held by Reverend Patricia Ross, Senior Minister of the First Congregational Church of Christ, with religious leaders from the Catholic, Christian and Jewish communities. Other participants currently include Reverend Sylvia Eagen, Interim Minister Salem United Church of Christ, Reverend Lynn Smouse Lopez of the Ainsworth United Church of Christ and Sister Armadene Bean of the Sisters of the Holy Names. This is the first interfaith effort of its kind in Portland. Reverend Ross agreed to lead the service because she believes domestic violence prevention must cross community and religious

### THE PROFESSOR OF PRAISE

## Ron Kenoly

The world's best-selling praise and worship leader Ron Kenoly is coming to Portland Christian Center with his band and joining the Portland Christian Center's 150-voice choir for two fabulous worship and praise concerts on Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup> and Sunday May 16<sup>th</sup>. The date is in support of Kenoly's latest album, Majesty (Integrity Music) which peaked at #1 on the Contemporary Christian Music (CCM Update) worship and praise charts. With almost 4 million records sold and almost ten albums under his belt, Ron Kenoly has sold more recordings than any other worship and praise leader. He has popularized and made standards out of such paens as "Let Everything That Hath Breath," "Whose Report Shall You Believe," "Use Me" and "I See The Lord." He performs more overseas worship services than any other worship leader and routinely packs out 20,000 seat arenas abroad. Last year alone, Ron Kenoly traveled to five continents and logged more than 200,000 miles.

Kenoly's music differs from

gospel and contemporary Christian music in that his music is not meant to merely entertain the audience. As the worship leader, Ron Kenoly's task is to lead the congregation in creating a performance with God as their audience. There are no spectators at Ron Kenoly concerts. Everyone stands to their feet and participates. Ron Kenoly only serves as the catalyst in helping the congregation make a joyful noise unto the Lord. "It's the responsibility of me as a worship leader to put the focus on the Lord Jesus Christ," Kenoly explains. "My job is to lead the congregation in songs that give praise unto the Lord. They are the choir."

Ron Kenoly and his band will be in full concert with the Portland Christian Center's 150-voice choir Saturday May 15<sup>th</sup> and Sunday May 16<sup>th</sup> @ 7 PM each night at the Portland Christian Center, 5700 Southwest Dosh Road in Portland, Oregon.
