
## We Have Lift-off



OMSI brings space down to earth with a hands-on exhibit called Imagine Space! from May 29 September 6.

f you think Star Wars is as close as You can get to outer worlds this summer, think again! The countdown has begun at the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry for the arrival of the broadest collection of space artifacts and exhibits ever assembled in the Pacific Northwest!

Imagine Space!, OMSI"s summer exhibit, lands Memorial Day Weekend for a three-month habitation May 29 through September 6.

Visitors will experience firsthand the thrill of past, present and future space exploration through a variety of hands-on exhibits and displays, rare space artifacts and reproductions, and original artwork that combine science and technology with art and creativity.

"The mystery of space and the lure of uncharted territory intrigue millions of people, young and old, and is especially top-of-mind with the recent shuttle mission by John Glenn," explains Jim Todd, OMSI Astronomy and Space Education Coordinator. "Imagine Space! brings the final frontier to life. It's a total immersion into the wonder of space exploration, launching visitors on a journey of hands-on discovery, observation and study. It's the most comprehensive collection of space exhibits and artifacts ever to be shown in the Pacific Northwest."

Imagine Space! Features a broad range of fun, interactive activities that brings down to Earth for astronaut wannabes of all ages.

The exhibit also features dozens of original works of art by renowned

space artist Robert McCall, perhaps best known for creating the popular poster art for the movie 2001: Space Odyssey.

A complete educator "Flight Pack" including an exhibit overview, classroom activities and space-related resources, is available to teachers who bring their classes to OMSI.

Additional out-of-this world events and activities included in OMSI's "Summer of Space" are: the debut of OMSI's new motion simulator ride on May 29; the return of the popular OMNIMAX movie Destiny in Space, opening May 29; a variety of space-related summer Camps and Classes; OMSI's annual Space Celebration event on July 17 and 18, commemorating the 30th anniversary of man's first walk on the moon; and a variety of free summer Star Parties.

Imagine Space! Includes exhibits, artifacts and reproductions from the Columbus Ohio Science Institute (COSI), NASA, Boeing, Space Center Houston and The Cosmosphere.

Imagine Space! Is featured in OMSI's Changing Exhibits Hall, and space-related exhibits, labs and demos will be incorporated throughout the museum. The exhibit is included with OMSI general admission, \$6.50 for adults (ages 14-62) and \$4.50 for seniors (63+) and youths (4-13).
