Tibetan Nuns of Kathmandu

The Tibetan Buddhist Nuns in Kathmandu, Nepal will present Women's Freedom and Spiritual Liberation: An Evening of Sacred Performance, at Smith Ballroom, on the Portland State University campus, on Thursday evening, June 17 at 8 PM. Tickets cost \$15, available at Music Millennium & Fastixx (224-TIXX).

The North American tour of the nuns of Khachoe Ghakyil Nunnery marks the first time that a troupe of Tibetan nuns have traveled in the West to stage performances of sacred music, dance, and theater, and to introduce audiences to the central role women have played in the spiritual life of Tibet.

Khachoe Ghakyil Nunnery, in Kathmandu, is one of a new generation of nunneries established in exile. It was founded in 1986, under the direction of Lama Zopa Rinpoche, as a part of the world wide Buddhist Network The Foundation for the Preservation of the Mahayana Tradition. The nuns of Khachoe Ghakyil Nunnery have had the doors of a classical Buddhist education opened to them in a way that was unheard of in old Tibet.

The current suppression of religious freedom inside Tibet has caused hundreds of nuns to flee their homeland in recent years. This influx of nuns seeking religious freedom has brought a rapid increase in the population of the Nunnery from the original five nuns to the current count of two hundred. One of the primary reasons for this North American Tour is to raise funds so that facilities can be expanded to suit the ever-increasing needs of the Khachoe Ghakyil Nunnery.
