Chris Rock will unveil his all-new stand-up act in an exclusive HBO comedy event shot June 17-19 at the legendary Apollo Theatre in Harlem. Chris Rock: Bigger & Blacker debuts Satur-

The New York Times described Chris Rock as "probably the funniest and smartest comedian working today," while Vanity Fair called him "young, gifted and the funniest man in America." The Washington Post championed him as `a brilliant comic, a cheering presence, a humble star," noting, "his comedy is full of intelligence, impudence and take-no-prisoners social comment." His hit late-night show, "the Chris rock show," will return to HBO for its fourth season this September. Presented from New York, the weekly show features Rock's signature high-energy blend of comedy, music and talk, with guests from entertainment, politics and other fields. "The Best of The Chris rock

Show" will be released on HBO Home video in late summer.



Wild Wild Will 🔊

In his latest film, the comedy-adventure "Wild Wild West," Will Smith plays a character who is, like the actor himself, long on charm and style. He's James T. West, a special government agent assigned to protect the president of the United States (circa 1869) from a brilliantly diabolical assassin whose arsenal of weapons includes an 80-foot mechanical tarantula. It was a role that Smith thoroughly enjoyed.

"James West is the coolest man around," says Smith. "He's straightforward and direct. There's a certain way to do things - a code - and that's what he lives by." Which is not to say that West is always on top of the situation. "What I wanted to bring to the character was just a touch of uncertainty," he says, believing it's the uncertainty that humanizes the hero. "You know he's going to do everything in his power to win, but you're not completely sure how it's going to come out until it's done."

Smith credits much of the film's buoyancy to the relationship between his character and the Artemus Gordon character played by Kevin Kline, as two operatives working on the same but employing entirely different methods and not always in perfect communication. "West is a man of action," Smith explains, "whereas Artemus relies on

to do his work.' The trouble with Artemus is that he tends to fill up his partner's pockets with ingenious explosive devices and other useful contraptions without always letting him know. "I find out about 'em at really inopportune moments," says Smith. "It would be nice if he let me know before he slipped something into my pocket. But he means well, and it does make for great comedy."

It was partly the comic element that interested Smith when he given the script was by his

former "Men in Black" director, Barry Sonnenfeld. But he warmed to "Wild Wild West" because of the whole range of elements it contained: "excitement, action, adventure, amazing visual effects," and what he calls "a brilliant interaction" between himself and his fellow stars, Kevin Kline, Kenneth Branagh and Salma Hayek.

Filming on location in Santa Fe, New Mexico, also gave Smith an oppor-

tunity to take a 3-week crash course on horseback riding, an experience about which he will only say, "You have to have a really good saddle."

"The Apollo is The only place to play," says Rock of the famed venue. He plans to cover a wide range of topics in his new material, including race and relationships. Rock selected the title of the special, he says, as "a knock-off on LL Cool J's second album, 'Bigger & Deffer," It's a title that puts pressure on myself."

mitri Matheny has just been named "Best New Artist" in the JazzIz Readers Poll (along with Brad Mahldau, Ravi Coltrane and Stefon Harris) and "Talent Deserving Wider Recognition: in the Down BEAt Internaitonal Critics Poll. A rising star celebrated for his "warm romantic tone," "soaring lyrcism" and "masterful technique," Matheny is a jazz artist whose inimitable sound has been described as "so cool it'll run a shiver through your martini."

Born on Christmas Day in Nashville, Tennessee, and raised in Georgia and Arizona, Dmitri began playing the trumpet at age 9. He is an honors graduate of the Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan and of the Berklee College of Music in Boston. While in college, the young trumpeter led his own bands while working professionally with the Tempatations, Martha Reeves, the True Colors Big Band and Sam Rivers. In 1989 he graduated magna cum laude from Berklee and relocated to the San Francisco Bay Area.

Inspired by his teacher and mentor the legendary flugelhornist Art Farmer, Matheny set aside the trumpet a decade ago and has since become identified with the more lyrical flugelhorn. Today, Matheny performs over 100 concerts annually on tour with the Dmitri Matheny Group, Dmitri Matheny Jazz Orchestra and Dmitri Matheny & Darrell Grant Duo. He has appeared at the Monterey,

Telluride, and San Francisco jazz festivals, in night clubs from Portland to Poland, and in prestigious concert halls worldwide, including regular appearances in New York at the Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall.

Matheny has released three critically-acclaimed CDs as a leader on the Monarch Records label: Red Reflections (1995), Penumbra: The Moon Sessions (1997), and Starlight Café (1998).
