

additional options for people to have a dual citizenship and actively participate in both countries, or drop citizenship with the US and continue their residency as a foreign resident.

Naturally, this proposal throws the traditional thinking about what a government "is" into disarray. The tax implications are mind boggling. The governments of existing landbased countries see this proposal as a direct threat to their sovereignty. The general public sees it as a way

Complications


The traditionalists argue that the inception of virtual countries will totally decimate the funding base and integrity of these emergency services. The virtual country proponents argue that the biggest threat to mankind is now coming from the new breed of techno-criminals, not the blood thirsty anarchists of the past. And they envision a sharing of responsibility between the virtual and land-based countries. Some vocalize their concern over a loss of national loyalty and the general state of confusion that would be created. Lawyers see full employment for themselves for

the next 1,000 years. But the Internet Commission sees it as a way to elevate its own status to ruler of the entire world.

How would you solve this dilemma? How much authority does the Internet Commission have? Are they destined to become the first true global government? Who wins and loses with this proposal? Are we on a path to destruction, or is this offering an unprecedented opportunity for our future?


