

### Seahawks' Coach Holmgren Debuts

CHENEY, Wash. (AP)-The Seattle Seahawks got a quick introduction to Mike Holmgren's practice philosophy at Sunday's opening of training camp.

Rather than allow the team to ease into camp the first day, Holmgren interrupted proceedings midway through a morning session and explained to the entire team what he expects to see in first-and-10 situations.

The chat session illustrated the new Seahawks' coach's emphasis on detail and his willingness to take time out from practice to discuss his philosophy.

"I want to explain to them what the drill was. I want to explain to them what I expect of them," said Holmgren, whose predecessor, Dennis Erickson, typically took a more hands-off approach in practice.

According to All-Pro defensive end Michael Sinclair, Holmgren has made a strong early impression on Seahawks players.

"When we first came to camp, he explained his philosophy," said Sinclair, starting his ninth year with

the team. "He just said, 'We're going to pay more attention to details. Because if you can't do the little things, then you can't play for me."

Added Ricky Watters, "With coach Holmgren, we're going to be very disciplined."

But, Watters said, Holmgren's discipline also has a soft side.

"Coach Holmgren is always positive," the running back said. "Even when something goes wrong he's still positive about it."

Holmgren, the former Green Bay Packers coach who took over in Seattle after Erickson was fired following an 8-8 season, is trying to get the Seahawks to the playoffs for the first time since 1988.

He liked what he saw Sunday.
"This was a good day. This is
fun," he said. "You see a little bit of
the rust, but you also see great enthu-

siasm and great effort."

For Holmgren, seeing his players take the field was a reward for the months of preparations leading up to camp.

"Once we get out on the field, there's not a lot of paperwork," he said. "It's just football, so it's fun."

"We're very excited about this opportunity," said Thomas, who led the Detroit Pistons to consecutive NBA titles in 1989 and 1990 and is former co-owner and general manager of the Toronto Raptors. "The

CBA has always had huge potential, but we look forward to helping the league realize its full potential."

The CBA's nine teams are organized as an association with approximately 40 owners. Thomas said he plans to reorganize it into a single entity league with the nine franchises reporting to the league.

The NBA will continue to use the CBA as its developmental league and provide both financial and professional support.
