onnie Laws, the enter tainer saxophonist will be playing at the 8th annual Virgo Birthday Bash on Saturday, September 18th on board the Portland Spirit.

As the third sibling in a live of four talented musicians, saxophonist Ronnie Laws has a deep empathy for the concept of family - immediate, universal and otherwise. So it comes as little surprise that when Blue Note President, Bruce Lundvall approached him with the idea of rerecording a landmark pop album of his choice for Blue Note's ongoing Covers Series, Laws would turn to Harvest For the World, an 8-song fan favorite from the elec-

trifying, 6-member edition of R&B legends, The Isley Brothers. Though that gold-selling LP was sandwiched between two platinum-selling, hitstacked classics (The Heat is On (1975) and Go For Your Guns (1977), Harvest for the World (recorded on the family's own T-Neck label in 1976) is reflected on today with fondness as a sleeper of rootsy social consciousness, Sly-influenced funk/ rock and exceptionally tender balladry.

Laws covered the title track on his album, Deep Soul (Par Records - 1992) which wet his appetite to tackle the entire album. Over the course of twoand-a-half months, Laws and his assistant producer, Kevin Floinoy (Keyboardist/road) shaped the basic tracks for the seven songs and opening "Prelude." "The mood character of each selection dictated how I would ap-


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proach it," he explains. "Some of Ronald Isley's original lead vocals lent themselves to more of a tenor approach and other more of a soprano touch. Then I decided to take a different twist by playing flute on "People of Today. I haven't featured that instrument on any recordings in a

Ronnie Laws is a proven natural at combining the exploratory heart of Jazz with the broader reaching strains of soul and pop music. His first hit, "Always There" (credited as Ronnie Laws and Pressure on the original 45) was one of the most popular, saxdriven, crossover hits of 70's jazzfunk fusion. He ushered in the more influential artist.

sensualization of the soprano sax with Ouiet Storm gems such as "Grace", "Karmen" and "Just Love." The title track of his third album, Friends and Strangers propelled him to gold sales in 1977 and garnered him fame at adult contemporary radio with the lush "Stay Awake" (1981). He was a member of the 70's most respected R&B band, Earth, Wind & Fire, preserved on their album, Last Days and Time (Columbia 1972) but he quit the group after one year to broaden his concept as a
