In Loving Memory Of Rosie Lee Carson

Rosie Lee Carson was born in Bald Knob, Arkansas, August 19, 1909, to the marriage of Mary McCoy Haynes and Henry Haynes. She was the second of five children. She talked often of her youth and her entrepreneurial spirit, doing things such as selling hot tamales to the train patrons as they would pass through town. After living in Little Rock, Detroit, and Chicago, she migrated to Oregon in 1944 where she moved to Vanport. Always the entrepreneur, she not only worked in the ship yard but she would also cook and sew on the side.

She was an active and faithful member at Hughes Methodist Church and St. Andrew's United Church of Christ, which is the present day "Ainsworth United Church of Christ". She has served as President of the Usher Board, taught Sunday School and worked with the young women's clubs. She was also a loyal member of the O.C.W. Harriett Tubman Club.

She married Arthur Carson September 3, 1954. They were married for 28 loving years before his home-going in 1982.

In her latter years, Rosie Lee

enjoyed spending time with her family and anyone's kids. She loved to share her wisdom and comical antidotes on whosoever's attention she had at that moment. Her more recent favorite quote has been, "I'm not complaining. I've had a good life. I don't mind being old, but it's so inconvenient!"

Rosie had one son, John Thornton, and grandson, Michael Carson, who both preceded her in death. She is survived by daughter Evelyn Flowers and her husband Billy Flowers, god-daughter Pamela Cage, stepdaughter Carolyn Carson, stepson Ronnie Carson, grandchildren; Chris-
