## Domestic assault and kidnap of 5-year-old boy

On Friday, October 22, 1999, at 5:45 a.m., North Precinct officers responded to a report of a serious domestic assault in the 4900 block of N. Houghton Street. On arrival uniform officers discovered the victim, a 35-year-old female, had been pistol whipped about the head sustaining multiple lacerations. In the course of trying to defend herself, the victim also sustained broken bones in both hands as well as a broken arm. The victim was tied to a post in the basement on Thursday, at approximately 8 p.m., and her 5-year-old son was kidnapped at gunpoint.

The victim remained bound in the basement for over 9 1/2 hours, until she was able to chew her way through her restraints, which consisted of ropes and extension cord. The victim broke free and fled to a neighbor's residence where 911 was called. The victim was transported to Emanuel Hospital where she was admitted over the weekend due to her injuries. The victim identified the suspect as her boyfriend, 31-year-old, Steven Ray McCluskey. Information lead to the arrest of McCluskey on Friday, October 22, 1999, at approximately 1

p.m. by officers of the Lincoln City Police Department, who spotted McCluskey walking. A short time later, the victim's stolen vehicle was located in the Lincoln City Outlet Mall with the kidnapped child unharmed inside. McCluskey was lodged at the Multnomah County Detention Center on the following charges: One count Attempt Aggravated Murder, one count Assault 1 (with firearm), seven counts Kidnap 1, two counts Robbery 1 (with firearm), two counts theft 1, one count Unauthorized Use of Motor Vehicle.

## Detectives release names of suspects in double homicide

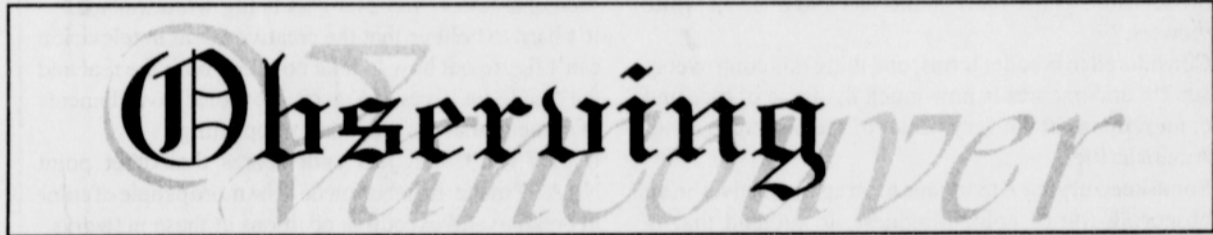

- Barnard Joseph Wallace February 20, 1960 8925 S.E. Flavel Charges: 2 counts abuse of a corpse; 1 count each tampering with physical evidence, hindering prosecution and PCSII (Heroin) Bail - \$200,000

October 24, 1966 15847 S.E. Stark; #9 Portland, OR Bail - \$150,000 Charges: 1 count each tampering with physical evidence, hindering prosecution and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. Search warrants were served at the following addresses:

The bodies of the two victims were found October 7 along Northeast Palmer Mill Rd. Other arrest in this case are pending.



## Symphony hits Vancouver in November

Spanish composer Isaac Albeniz. Salvador Brotons will conduct. Originally an piano piece, La Vega was arranged for guitar and orchestra by Jack Marshall from the Alhambra Piano Suite. Albeniz was born in 1860 in Spain and studied piano in Germany, England, and Belgium. As time went on he focused more on composition, composing La Vega around 1889. It is considered one of his major works and the title refers to the flowering fields that inspired him during a trip to Grenada. In addition, Mr. Parkening will perform three of the Spanish Dances by Catalan composer Enrique Granados. Granados, a magnificent pianist and composer, began composing the series of twelve dances in 1892 when he was 25. The orchestra will conclude the concert with Brahms' Symphony No. 1 in C minor. Begun in 1862, Brahms' labored for fourteen years to complete this symphony, refusing to be rushed. Premiered in 1876, it was initially met with a cold audience reception. Now, however, it is one of the most popular symphonies for audiences. Tickets are available at all ticketmaster locations including G.I. 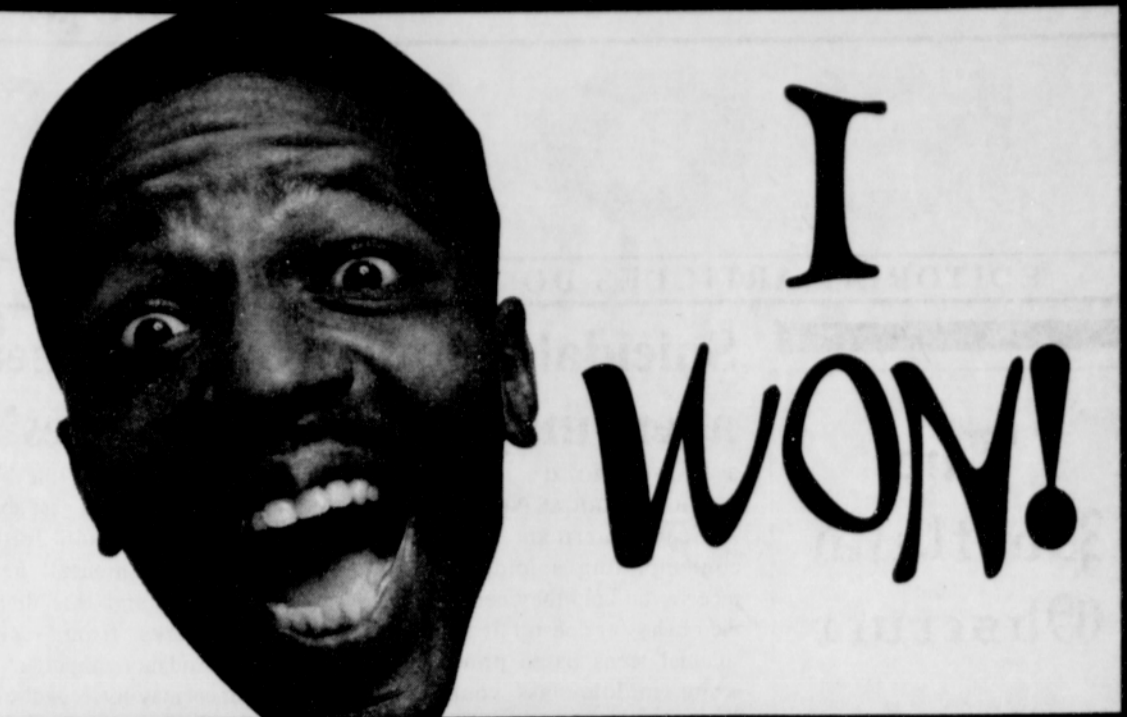

## Police investigate exposure suspect

Officers at Vancouver Police Central precinct are investigating reports of male Hispanics Suspect targeting female high school students walking to and from school in the 18th Street and Carlson area of Vancouver. A 14-year-old student returning from Ft. Vancouver High School first saw the suspect at 3 p.m. on October 12. She reported the suspect as a male Hispanic, 25-35 years driving a newer small green pickup. The pickup had purple squiggly lines on the sides. The license plate is similar to A91741A. The subject passed the victim slowly driving by. The suspect turned around and stopped when he was next to her and opened his door so she could see he was stimulating himself. The subject did not say anything to the victim. The second occurrence was October 18th at 0713 in the

morning. Two female students saw the subject walking in the 18th Street and Carlson area. As the suspect walked by the girls, they noticed he was exposing himself to them. The girls reported the incident to security officers at Fr. Vancouver High School. Central Police officers have initiated a saturation patrol during the high-risk times when students walk to and from school. The Clark County Sex offender unit has been asked to review known sex offenders for a similar green truck. A similar incident happened this morning near Columbia River High School where a Hispanic male driving a green pick up with swooshes on the side stopped and exposed himself to student walking to school. Refer CCSO #99-13927. The police are requesting the public's help in identifying the suspect in this case. If anyone has information regarding this truck or it's driver, they are asked to call Sgt.
