Christian radio raises funds to feed homeless

This Thanksgiving, K-LOVE Radio and a consortium of 37 rescue missions are joining forces to raise money to feed hungry in Portland and across the nation. The fund-raiser began Nov. 8 on the K-LOVE Radio Network and ends Nov. 23 with Announcer Mike Novak broadcasting live from the Portland Rescue Mission. All funds from Portland listeners will go to feed the homeless at Portland area rescue missions.

Feed The Hungry '99 is a project that will span the country, giving money to mission ministries in cities where K-LOVE broadcasts. Volunteers will take donations calls through Nov. 23 and will keep track of all pledges. Callers will be instructed how to make donations to the Portland Rescue Mission and City Team Ministries, a Portland-based organization dedicated to feeding the homeless. In the last three years, this program has been used to successfully raise money to feed the hungry in Portland. This is the first time the program has been launched nationwide in all K-LOVE broadcasting areas.

K-LOVE President Dick Jenkins believes Feed the Hungry '99 will be the beginning of an ongoing project to help the homeless.

"It is a privilege for K-LOVE Radio to be able to partner with rescue missions from across the country on the Feed the Hungry '99 project, Jenkins said. "We are hoping this campaign is so successful that it becomes an annual event for

David Harms, president of The Idea Agency and chairman of the board at Portland Rescue Mission, said Feed the Hungry '99 could touch from 50,000 to 100,000 lives this Thanksgiving. The impact will depend on the amount of money raised.

The cost to feed a hungry person is on average about \$1.83 per meal. All participating rescue missions are affiliated with the International Union of Gospel Missions.

"I don't know whether he (Jesus) is a sinner but I know this: I was blind and now I can see!" (Jesus healing the blind man... John 9:25) Last week, I utilized the story of Jesus healing a blind man and receiving criticism instead of gratitude to write about a healing service I attended that seemed to offer miracles but left me with more questions than answers. Are special services necessary for God

to heal? How did the preacher know so much about me? Was the women healed of blood disorder simply because hands were placed on her? What about those who are not healed? Are there other, less dramatic ways we can be involved in a healing ministry? For years, I struggled with feelings of inadequacy as a pastor and Christian. Should I be leading healing services? Could God heal others though me? In other words, why was I so afraid to take action? So recently, along with several leaders of our church, we began to look into the miracle of

God's healing. Our first Step was to study scripture. Several months ago we invited leaders from another church to talk about their healing ministry. They emphasized that as Christians we are already deeply involved in god's miracle of healing. Every time we visit someone in need, send a card, deliver a basket of food, bake a cake, offer a prayer or simply share a conversation over a soothing cup of coffee we are offering God's miracle of healing. We could stop feeling inadequate and start learning how to improve. Then the miracle of God's healing began.
