Vegas style games at Chinook Winds Casino

A ribbon cutting ceremony took place Friday, November 12, 1999 to celebrate the long-awaited opening of Las Vegas style games at Chinook Winds Casino in Lincoln City. The new games will include Craps, Roulette, Pai-Gow Poker, Let-it-Ride, Caribbean Stud, Aruba Stud, Progressive Blackjack, and Big 6 Wheel in addition to Bingo, Keno, Poker, Blackjack, and

the 1,000 slot machines already available to the casino's patrons.


It took nearly two years of negotiations between the State of Oregon and the Confederated Tribes of Siletz to reach an agreement which would allow the casino to bring these games on line.

The Compact for the operation of class III gaming under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (which includes the new games) was signed by Governor John Kitzhaber on September 14 and then sent to the Secretary of Interior for approval. The Secretary of the Interior approved the compact and it became effective October 29, 1999

The terms of the agreement allow the Casino to add additional casino style games as the opportunity presents. In addition, the new Compact authorizes Chinook Winds Casino to increase the number of slot machines to meet

customer demand. Chinook Winds is the third casino in the state to offer Class III games. According to Tribal Chairman, Delores Pigsley, additional revenue generated by the new games will go back to the Tribe, to be used for health, education, housing, economic development and charitable contributions as is stipulated in the Tribe's long-term plan in agreement with the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act. A percentage of the proceeds will go

back into the surrounding community in the form of charitable donations. Chinook Winds was chosen as the cowinner of Business of the Year in Lincoln City for 1997 for the many contributions which have already been made to the area. In addition, Chinook winds employs 735 people, which in itself has a strong economic impact on the surrounding communities.
