Radio broadcast raises funds to feed homeless

K-Love Radio Network and a consortium of 37 rescue missions successfully raised \$43,389 to feed the hungry and homeless across the nation for the holidays. Portland residents gave \$9,635 to provide meals for the needy at Portland Rescue Mission and City Team Ministries.

The Feed The Hungry '99 fund-raiser was broadcast on the K-Love Radio Network from Nov. 17 to Nov. 23. The money raised provides 23,710 meals for hungry people at the rescue missions throughout the United States.

"Feeding the hungry and the less fortunate is a tangible way that we can show the love of God." said K-Love President Dick Jenkins. "That's why we want to make this an annual event here at K-Love."

In the last three years, this program has been used to raise money to feed the hungry in Portland. This is the first time the program has been launched nationwide in all K-Love Radio broadcast areas.

Is Invited Back to NBC's "Today Show" For 2nd Year

The legendary Detroit-based choir, The Whitfield Company, has had quite a comeback year. When their founder Thomas Whitfield died in 1992, the gospel music industry abandoned the group and predicted its demise. However, the group stayed intact amid many challenges and released their first album since Thomas' death. The album Still... the Whitfield Company (Crystal Rose Records) was a big gospel hit and the single "Holding On" received it's television debut on NBC's "Today Show" last December as the choir kicked-off the news magazine's annual outdoor Christmas concert series. The choir has been invited back to close the "Weekend Today Show's" Christmas series at Rockefeller Plaza Sunday, December 19th @ 8:00 AM (EST).

The choir's first network television appearance in their twenty-two year history caused the gospel industry to take a second look. The ensemble received several long overdue accolades. Aside from Thomas posthumously receiving the Stellar Awards' (the Gospel Grammies) lifetime achievement award, the choir made several television appearances and was inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame this past October. Their song "Don't Give Up On Jesus" was featured on the gold WOW 1999 compilation album. In the sweetest of ironies, the label that dropped the group from its roster upon Thomas' death, released an anthology of the choir's best loved hits this year entitled, The Best of Thomas Whitfield: We Remember Thomas.

New Beginnings pastor spreads churches internationally

Pastor Larry Huch is the founder and Senior Pastor of New Beginnings Christian Center in Portland, Oregon. He and his wife Tiz have pioneered six churches in America and Australia. The success of these churches is due to their enthusiasm, personal commitment to evangelism,

and teaching God's people to win. Pastor Huch speaks on his own personal experience: "I know what it is to live under the yoke of sin and iniquity. I know how it feels to hate the way you are, but to lack the ability to change yourself.

"You see, I grew up in the inner-city of St. Louis, Missouri in a life of crime and violence. By the time I was in my early twenties, I was living in Columbia, South America smuggling drugs into the States. After I almost died of a drug overdose, I realized that no matter how much money I had, I could not fill the void in my heart. I knew that there must be something more in life.

"Not more than a year after the overdose, a young man shared the message of Jesus Christ with me. I got saved, delivered from addictions and was on my way to Heaven. It would be several years however, before I would experience total freedom.

"Though I was saved, I was still bound by generational curses. I lived day to day with anger and rage that I could Jesus has a new beginning for you

not understand or overcome. I even brought this anger into

my marriage with Tiz.

"Then one day I finally realized—not only was my salvation bought for me at Calvary, but when Jesus took my sin upon Himself, He redeemed me from every curse. Once I realized this, I was completely delivered from the generational curse of anger that had dominated my life!

"Through this freedom, Tiz and my marriage was restored and we were able to fulfill the calling God had placed on our lives. Over the next twenty years we went on to build and pastor six churches in America and Australia, where we have seen thousands saved and delivered.

"In 1990, God moved us from Adelaide, South Australia to Portland, Oregon to build New Beginnings Christian Center. We have seen God do amazing things there! NBCC has grown from a group of ten people to over 5,000 in just a few

"In 1994, Tiz and I were with Benny Hinn at his crusade when God spoke to me about the new work He desired us to move into. He told me that not only did He desire for His children to be healed of infirmities, but also delivered from the stronghold of generational curse, just as I had been! He had given me freedom from generational curses that bound my life and now it was time for me to share with the world how they too could experience freedom!"
