### Seahawks 23, Chiefs 14

Hall of Famer Steve Largent was on hand to watch the Seattle Seahawks play their final regular-season game in the Kingdome. So was Chuck Knox, the franchise's most successful coach.

They saw Mike Holmgren's team at its best. In a game Seattle had to win in to get back to the playoffs for the first time since 1988, the Seahawks beat Kansas City 23-14 on Sunday to end a four-game losing streak.

Billionaire owner Paul Allen brought Holmgren to Seattle in an effort to get the Seahawks to the Super Bowl. Allen got his money's worth Sunday.

If the Seahawks beat the New York Jets on the road next Sunday, they'll capture the AFC West title for the first time since Knox and Largent's 1988 team did it. It also would mean a home playoff game Jan. 8 or 9.

"Let's not make it the last game in the Kingdome," Seahawks defensive end Michael Sinclair said. "It's nice and toasty in here this time of the year." "It's on us now," Pro Bowl linebacker Chad Brown of Seattle said. "It's what we want."

Clinching their first winning season since 1990, the Seahawks (9-6) ended Kansas City's four-game winning streak by beating the Chiefs (9-6) for the second time in six weeks.

performances in Medford and Roseburg, \$20,000.

- The Portland Opera for in-school educational tours across Oregon, including Coos, Crook, Deschutes, Douglas, Jackson, Jefferson, Klamath, Marion, Multnomah, and Umatilla counties, a \$25,000 payment on a three-year commitment of \$75,000.
- Portland Art Museum open houses for students from areas served by Pacific Power, which in 1999 included Albany, Pendleton, Bend, Coos Bay and the Coquille Indian Tribe, in addition to Walla Walla and Yakima schoolchildren in Washington, a \$15,000 payment on a four-year commitment of \$60,000.
- Oregon Historical Society's circulating exhibits, a \$5,000 payment of a \$25,000 commitment over five years.
- Bend's High Desert Museum for its Birds of Prevexhibit, a \$10,000 payment on a five-year commitment of \$50,000.

Richardson was named to the foundation's board of directors at its annual meeting Dec. 6. At its meeting, the board approved grants to arts and cultural organizations in the five states served by Pacific Power and Utah Power. The fourth quarter grants brought the foundation's total funding to more than \$2.4 million in 1999 for education and research, health and welfare, and civic and community improvements in addition to arts and culture.
