Annual Inner Peace Retreat welcomes Bishop De Roo

The annual Inner Peace Retreat will be held on Saturday, February 5 at St. Pius X parish (1280 NW Saltzman Road) in Cedar Mill. The retreat will run from 9:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. the Inner Peace Retreat is sponsored by the Archdiocese of Portland's Office of Justice and Peace, and is hosted this year by the Social Ministry Council of St. Pius X parish. The presenters for this year's retreat will be Bishop Remi De Roo, retired Bishop of Victoria, Canada, and Pearl Gervais. The morning session will focus on "Sources of Inner Peace," and the afternoon session will consider "Outer Justice Actions" as inner peace becomes alive in public life.

Bishop Remi De Roo was born and raised in Swan Lake, Manitoba. He was ordained a priest in 1950, and received a Sacred Theology Doctorate in 1952 from the Angelicum University in Rome. He was named Bishop of Victoria in

Arneda Battle Givens was the first child born to the loving union of Eally Battle and Mary Gregors Battle in Wellston, Oklahoma on April 23, 1912. Armeda attended Douglas Grammar School in Fallis, OK & Dunbar High School in Wellston, OK and completed business classes at Yakima Valley College in Yakima, Washington.

In 1930, she united with Bethlehem Baptist Church in Fallis, Oklahoma, Rev. Brown was her Pastor. She often shared with family members her experience when she received Christ. She said, "The Holy Spirit Jesus that had come into her life. She was a great woman of faith and believed God. She wrote in her autobiography that her favorite song is "I'm Going To Trust In The Lord" and her favorite hymn is "Guide Me Oh Thou Great Jehovah." She served in the Church at Fallis as Secretary of the Sunday School.

Arneda united in marriage to Princy Givens (who preceded her in death) at Fallis, Oklahoma in 1933 by Rev. G.E. Smith. Later they moved from Oklahoma to Chandler, Arizona in 1935. There she united with the Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Rev. E.R. James, Pastor. She was active in Sunday School and the

Church. Later, they moved to Phoenix, Arizona where she united with the St. John Baptist Church, Rev. L.J. Dunbar, Pastor. She was a teacher in the Sunday school and served as Secretary of the Church for 14 years. Her other services included President of the District Jr. Woman's Auxiliary for 3 years, Secretary of the Zion District Association for 7 years.

In 1965, Arneda & family moved to Yakima, Washington where she united with the Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church. In 1969 the family moved to Portland, Oregon where she joined New Hop Baptist Church. Later, she united with St. Paul Baptist Church in 1972 under the Pastorate of Rev. John Holiday. Rev. Holiday resigned and moved away and Rev. James C.E. Faulkner was called to Pastor. Here at the St. Paul Baptist Church she continued her faithful work and witness, teaching in the Sunday School, Treasurer of the Church, Chairperson of the Deaconess and Mother's Board and Chairperson of the Dorcus Circle of the Missionary Department. Additionally, she also served in the Union District Association, Missionary II Auxiliary, Finance Secretary and District Sunday School Congress.

At the time of press deadline there was no information on Wilburt Murlin Givens, but hour hearts go out to the Givens family who lost their loving Mon and Brother during the Holiday Season, and at the beginning of the New Millenium.
