The 1960s Legacy of African American Leadership

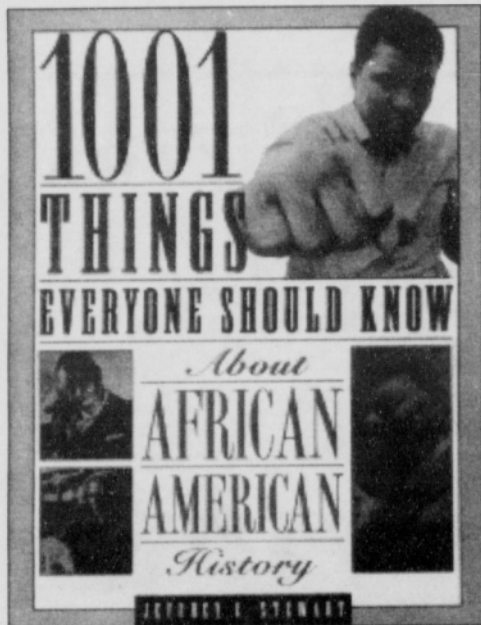

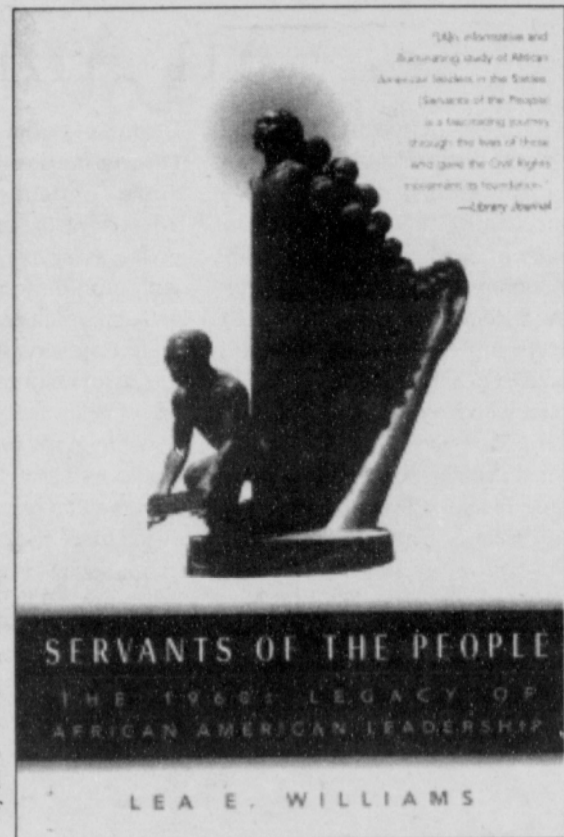
1001 Things Everyone Should Know About African American History
