## Symphony plans young artist concerts

Your chance to hear some of the area's most talented young musicians will be March 11 and 12 when the three winners of the Vancouver Symphony's fifth annual Young Artist competition perform in concert with the Symphony. The instruments this year include a violinist, a violist and a bassoonist.

The 2000 competition winners include Aaron Soloway, and 18-year-old bassoonist from Parkrose High School in Portland, 17-year-old violist Joel Thoreson from Hudson's Bay High School, and Justin Mackewich, a 17-yearold violinist who attends the Vancouver School of Arts and Academics.

The Symphony's "Young Artist Perform" concerts will be at 2:30 p.m. Saturday, March 11, 2000 and at 7:00 pm, Sunday, March 12, 2000 at the Royal Durst Theatre in the Vancouver School of Arts and Academics. The school is located at 3101 Main St., Vancouver. The Symphony will be under the direction of conductor Dr. Salvador Brotons.

Bassoonist Aaron Soloway will perform the first movement of Carl Maria Von Weber's Concerto in F, Op. 75 Aaron has been a bassoonist with the Portland Youth Philharmonic for four years and is currently co-principal bassoon. He attended Boston University Tangelwood Institute last summer and the Eastern Music Festival in North Carolina in 1998, and Sequoia Chamber Music Workshop. Aaron took first place in the 1999 Oregon State Solo competition, was the finalist in Portland Community Concert Association Young Artist Competition, and was a finalist in last year's Vancouver Symphony Young Artist Competition. He's valedictorian of Parkrose High School and has held numerous leadership positions in student government and clubs and is also an accomplished pianist.

Hudson's Bay Senior Joel Thoreson began studying the violin at the age of ten and took up the viola only a year and a half ago. He is currently in the first
