Dr. Fredrick Price, is the man known nation-wide as a best selling author of spiritually significant titles, the respected head of the successful television ministry "Ever Increasing Faith" and pastor of the largest sanctuary in the USA - the FaithDome in Los Angeles - and the keynote speaker at the African American Expo 2000. However, it is his entire family that runs the day to day operations that have made the ministry what it is today.

Especially his equally accomplished wife, best-selling author and social philanthropist and entrepreneur Dr.

Betty Ruth Price.

Walking In His Shadow Dr. Betty, as she called, is often asked about standing in the shadow of her famous husband, to which she always responds: I love it! It's a great shadow in which to be standing." When the Mississippi Native met and married Frederick KC Price, she not only gave the encouragement to build the ministry, but created the outreach programs that contributed to the success of the 11,000+sanctuary. Dr. Betty Price plays a vital role in her husband's ministry, as well as in the operation of the church.

Her influence in the development of the Crenshaw Christian Center and its nationwide television ministry has

earned her immense respect of her peers and the nickname of "Faith's First Lady."

Dr. Betty was presented an honorary Letterarum Doctorate Degree as well as one of the first women ordained to ministry. Her concern for others have led to the establishment of numerous programs and groups at Crenshaw Christian Center including:

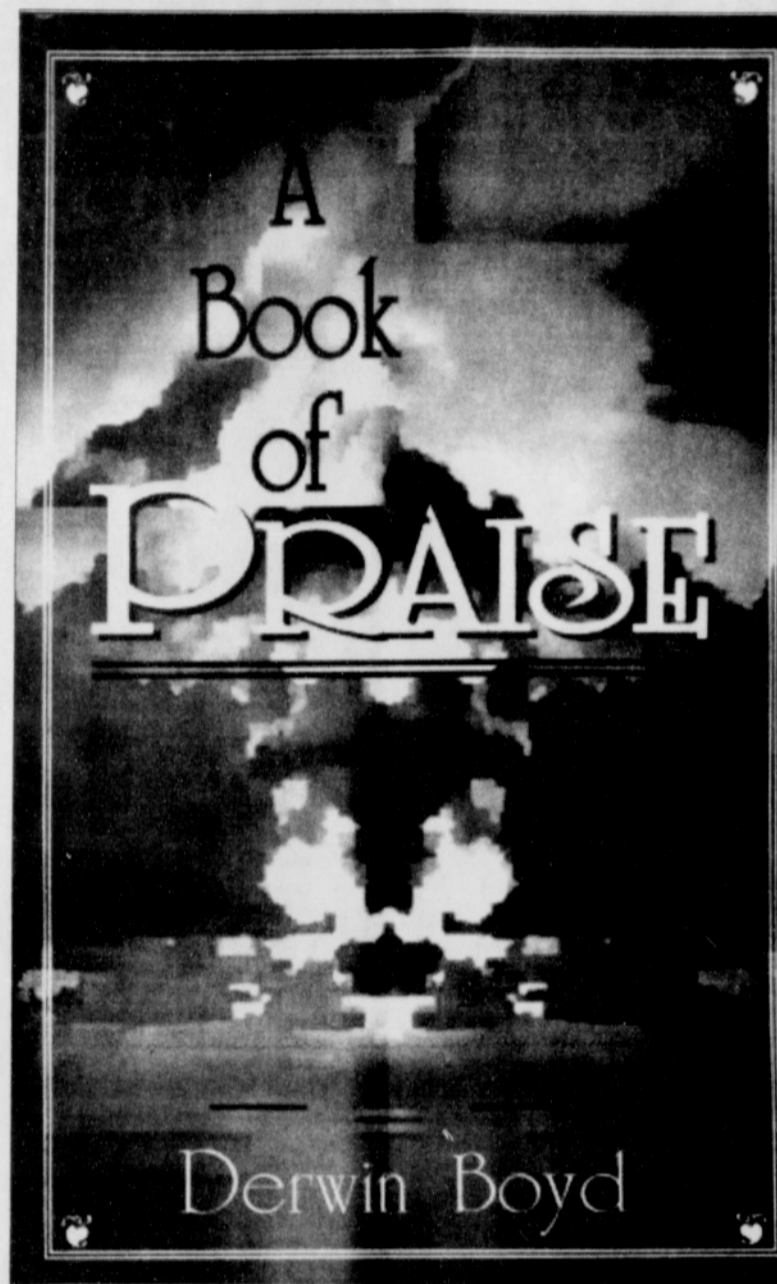
